Green County to Study Hospital Aid

MONROE — A study of hospitalization costs of indigent Green county residents who have had treatment at state institutions at county expense from 1935 to 1941 has been authorized by the Green county board finance committee with a view to cutting these costs, County Clerk Clarence Lengacher announced here.

Green County to Study Hospital Aid

Cost of persons getting treatment at state institutions exclusive of tuberculosis or orthopedic patients, runs to \$10,000 a year in this county, Lengacher said. The finance committee also announced the county will henceforth no longer pay into the reserve for the state unemployment compensation law. The county now has a \$5,500 reserve with the state under this law, but under a new law, the county does not have to pay any further into
