Lima movie fans who have seen "They Met in Bombay," with Clark Gable and Rosalind Russell, at the Ohio had it as one of the best films of the summer season.

Starting Tuesday at the Lyric is "The Trail of the Lonesome Pine," with alluring Sylvia Sydney and bashful Henry Fonda.

Described by those who have seen it as a great musical, "Moon Over Miami," at the Quilna, is drawing many fans.

At the Rialto is "The Great Swindle," with Jack Holt, and "Spirit of the West," starring Hoot Gibson.

"They Met in Bombay," in which Clark Gable and Rosalind Russell are co-starred on the Ohio screen, marks the seventh successful combination of the talents of Gable as star and Clarence Brown as director.

Gable freely credits Director Brown with giving him his first big opportunity in pictures.

Excitement is the keynote of the new mystery drama, "The Nurse's Secret," coming to the Sigma. A coldblooded killer nearly succeeds in committing a series of brutal crimes but is balked by a nurse and a shrewd detective.

With more thrills and bigger laughs than ever before, Lloyd Nolan and Lynn Bari meet aboard the crash-landed "Comanche Landed" in "Sleepers West," the 20th Century-Fox film which will open at the Lyric theatre on Tuesday.

Lloyd, again playing the role of that fast-talking detective, Michael Shayne, swaps witticisms with popular Lynn Bari over the whereabouts of the star witness Shayne is escorting to a murder trial. She's blonde Mary Beth Hughes, and a gangster is on board to keep her from testifying.

Half a dozen other colorful characters, including Edward Brophy and Ben "Shadlock" Carter, keep things at fever pitch and the film has a surprise climax that's a knockout.

Lovely Sylvia Sydney and Henry Fonda have the leads in "The Trail of the Lonesome Pine," which will complete the program.

If her heavy picture schedule permits, Betty will accept the generous offer and spend a week in Havana.

That role launched Gable's starring career. Subsequently it fell to Brown to direct him in such successes as "Possessed," "Chained," "Night Flight," "Idiot's Delight" and "Wife vs. Secretary."

Oddly enough, while Gable played a ruthless gangster in his first assignment under Brown, he again appears as an outlaw in "They Met in Bombay," his latest. In the current attraction, Gable portrays an outcast British army officer who turns his talents to artful swindling and robbery, operating in the social upper crust.

Crossing paths in Bombay with Miss Russell, who pursues a life vocation, Gable outwits his competitor in crime, then takes her as a professional partner as they flee with a fortune in loot. Hong Kong offers them questionable sanctuary after a thrilling escape from a freighter captured by sinister Peter Lorr, and the exciting trail of events eventually leads them back into the center of an international crisis in which they play heroic roles.

Their unique adventures are played against a constantly changing panorama of the exotic East. In the supporting cast, are Jessie Ralph, Edward Cinnelli, Matthew Boulton, Luis Alberni, Rosina Galli, Jay Novello and Reginald Owen.
