

### Delphos' Hope Of Pool Nears C o nsummation

(Lima News Bureau) DELPHOS, July 12-After being without a swimming pool here for several seasons, Delphos children are looking forward to having one. Sunday, July 20, has been tentatively fixed for dedication of the municipal pool at the athletic field by Mayor W. D. Swinart.

There still are additional lights to be installed and the filteration plant must be completed. Engineer arrived here Friday. A. E. Weger, service director said this week that he saw no reason for not completing the pool on time.

The pool will be 140 feet in diameter and has a water capacity of 325,000 gallons. The depth will be 18 inches to nine feet, the latter being in the center. A 15-horse power motor will pump water into the pool simultaneously, with the water pouring outfit. It empties itself in eight hours. There is a 30-feot sand beach surrounding

An appropriate program for the dedication is being arranged by Mayor Swihart.

It is nearing four years since agigation began for a new pool, following the old one in waterworks park being condemned by the state board of health. A citizens committee was appointed by municipal officials and in November 1937, electors voted a bond issue of \$41,000 to construct the pool and other improvements. With federal aid the work amounts to approximately \$100.000.

Even after the passage of the issue, there was delay after delay for varying causes, yet city officials never lost sight of the goal, a new pool. Work got underway last year for two rest rooms and those were completed by the fall and then came work on the stadium, bath houses and the pool, all part of the original program. It is located on the city athletic field, at the northern part of the city, having been purchased for the sewage treatment plant.
