Beerless Britons Mourn

LONDON, (U.P.)—There was more grumbling than beer Saturday night at the famous "Chain and Anchor" at the "Bird in Hand," and the "Kings Head" — all of which are pubs and all of which represent in these days the core of a real danger to the British war effort.

The average Britisher has shown the world that he can take a lot, but there is no inclination in official sources to disregard the traditional viewpoint that if you deprive him of his regular pint of bitter or ale, there will be trouble.

The London cockney has watched his home burn to the ground without comment, the Welsh miner had dodged bullets from raider planes, and the north country farmer has filled bomb holes in his fields without complaint.

The beer itself is not up to standard, due to lack of sugar and other essentials. Its alcoholic content is less, a change that was made over a period of months before it was realized by customers who meanwhile boasted about their increased capacity. Most of it is now aged the same as American prohibition "near beer."

OKLAHOMA CITY (U.P.)—Herbert K. Hyde, chairman of the platform and resolutions committee at the Republican national convention last year, said Saturday night that the views of Wendell Willkie no longer represent the policies of the Republican party or the 22,000,000 people who voted for him last November.

Hyde, a former U. S. district attorney here, said a majority of the people of America are opposed to establishing bases in Ireland, Scotland, and West Africa because it takes us another long step toward actual war.
