THIRD PAROLE PLEA IS HEARD

LONDON, O., July 16 (AP)—The State Parole and Pardon Commission weighed again today the parole application of Charles E. Wheland, former Uhrschville banker and sportsman, who confessed embezzling \$475,000 in 1936. Yesterday's hearing was his third, the case being continued twice by the commission.

Wheland was admitted to Ohio penitentiary New Year's Day, 1937, and was transferred to the Lonsdon prison farm March 29, 1940. Fifty-two years old, he is under one to 20-year sentence for misapplication of bank funds.

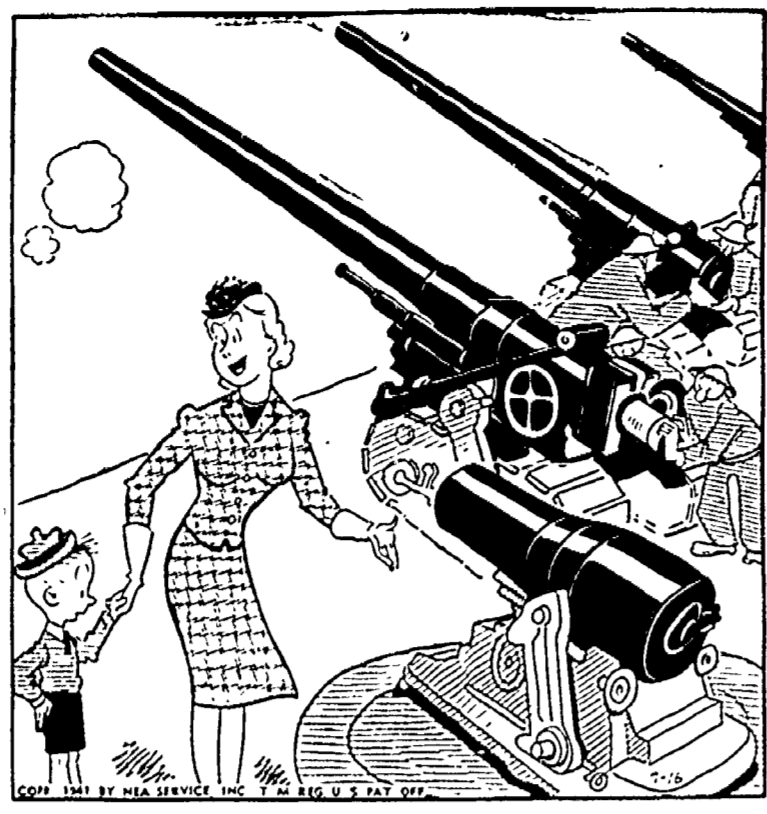
OFFICERS NAMED

METEORIC ODDITY

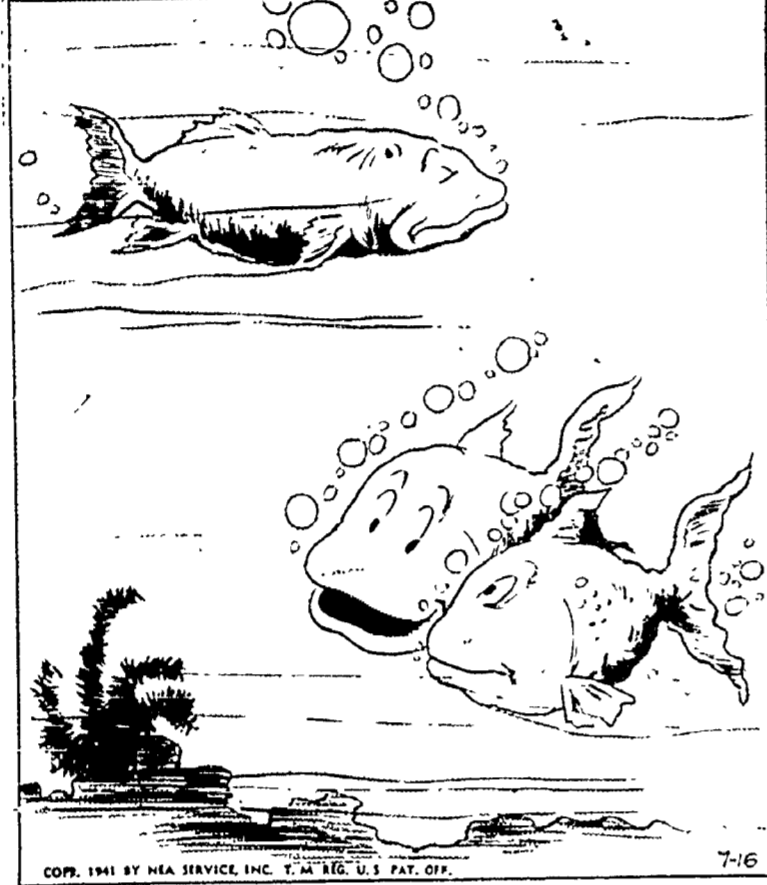

SHERIFFS AND DEPUTIES FOR NEW OHIO UNIT

JEFFERSONVILLE, O., July 16 (AP)—Sheriff Robert Bates of Jeffersonville, a leader in the unsuccessful fight to block expansion of the state highway patrol, today leads a new organization of law-enforcement officers.

He was elected president of the Sheriffs and Deputies-Association of Ohio at its initial meeting, with Sheriff Dick France, of Stark County, becoming vice president and Deputy Samuel Gaylord, of Jeffersonville, secretary.

Bates recently resigned as president of the Ohio Sheriffs-Association in protesting what he termed failure of the group to support lobbying against the patrol bill.

The new organization claims an enrollment of 35 officers, most of them eastern Ohio Democrats. Incorporators were Bates, Gaylord and Sheriff Clarence Crawford, of Monroe Co.

Purpose of the group, Bates said, is "to seek legislation beneficial to sheriffs and deputies." The association also will ask civil service and insurance for deputies, he added, with a statewide campaign to be launched immediately.

Hugo Alexander, Jeffersonville prosecutor, was appointed legal adviser, and Mayor Robert Price, of Amsterdam public relations representative.

QUITS TEACHING

NEW BREMEN, July 17.—Frank Kelley, agriculture teacher in the New Bremen high school the last four years, has resigned to accept a position with the Producers Co-operative-Association, at Toledo. The board of education met to accept Kelley's resignation and immediately employed Ray Deacon of Morrow, O., in his place.

SIDNEY, July 16.—A 16-ton semi-truck of the Kroger Grocery and Baking Co. overturned Monday about two and one-half miles east of Sidney on State Route 29.

RESOLUTION NO. 13-11 A PROPOSITION PROPOSED TO COOPERATE WITH THE DIRECTOR OF HIGHWAYS

WHEREAS, the public interest demands the improvement herein-after described; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Lima, State of Ohio, desires to cooperate with the Director of Highways of the State of Ohio, in accomplishing the improvement; Now, Therefore,

Section 1. That the public interest demands the improvement, under the provisions of Section 1183 and related sections of the General Code of Ohio, of that part of State Highway No. 659, situated in the City of Lima, County of Allen, and State of Ohio, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the south corporate line of the City of Lima, same being in the center line of John's Road at Station 267/60-19 as surveyed by the Department of Highways; thence north along the center line of said road over and along the center line of said St. Johns Road, a distance of 100 feet to a point and there terminate.

Section 2. That the Council of the City of Lima, State of Ohio, does hereby propose to cooperate with the Director of Highways of the State of Ohio, in the construction, reconstruction, improvement, widening, maintenance and repair of the above described portion of State Highway No. 659, by assuming and contributing its share of the cost thereof, said \$40,000 dollars, inclusive of engineering, preliminary construction and other incidental expenses.
