

Stage Show Is Booked For Friday Only At The Ohio

Audience participation event said to offer program packed full of laughs and fun for everyone.

For one day only at the Ohio theatre, "Scramby Amby," an audience participation show, will be offered Friday. With Ray Shannon in charge of the program, fun for all is provided as scrambled words are presented, with the audience winning prizes for unscrambling. Music will be provided by the "Vocalaires." Bob Hope and Dorothy Lamour in "Caught in the Draft," will conclude Thursday.

George Brent and Martha Scott are the stars of "They Dare Not Love," which commences at the Friday preview at the Quilna theatre with "The Richest Man in Town." Concluding films are "The Cowboy and the Blonde" starring Mary Etoe Hughes and George Montgomery, and "Murder Among Friends," starring John Hubbard and Marjorie Weaver.

Another Hopalong Cassidy adventure is the attraction at the Sigma theatre where "Pirates on Horseback" stars William Boyd in his most familiar role. Russell Hayden and Andy Clyde are his "side kats," while Eleanor Stewart provides the romantic angle. "Singapore Woman," the co-feature, stars Brenda Marshall, David Bruce, Virginia Field, Jerome Cowan and Rose Hobart.

Currently at the Lyne theatre is "San Francisco Docks," starring Burgess Meredith and Irene Hervey in a story combining drama, action and suspense with romantic scenes in the picturization of a longshoreman's valiant struggle to prove himself innocent of a murder charge. Featured is "Wagon Train."

Ray Shannon, garrulous kingpin of comedy, will bring to the stage of the Ohio theatre in Lima on Friday, July 18, 1941, his unique show, "Scramby Amby."

Playing "Scramby Amby" is fun for everyone in the audience, insuring to all an opportunity to participate in a topsy-turvy brain-teasing, intriguing contest of words with each awards.

Riding his beloved pony, Duke, at the head of a train of covered wagon desert trailblazers Tim Holt, new western star, comes to the screen of the Lyric theatre in "Wagon Train," the first of a series of six outdoor thrillers.

A powerful action-packed story, "Wagon Train," depicts the dangerous journey of a train of huge covered wagon frontiers carrying provisions to far western outposts in early frontier days. Holt, a youthful owner of a train, rides ahead of his outfit, scouts the trail, keeps on the lookout for marauding Indians and engages in hand-to-hand battles with six gun battles with road agents. At Beaver Forks he meets a girl who is enroute to Pecos to wed the son of his enemy. Matters reach a climax when his foe, the unscrupulous owner of the store at Pecos, lays plans to ambush Holt and his train, get his business and, in complete control of both trailblazers and freighters, he plans to sell food and supplies at his own exorbitant prices.
