### East Boosts Strong Grid Candidates

CHICAGO - The east, which last year failed to place a man in the starting College All-American lineup, should be well represented on the squad this summer. This is the opinion of eastern coaches who today cast ballots in the national voting contest to determine the team which will start the eighth annual All-Star game against the Chicago Bears, National Football League champions, in Chicago's Soldiers' Field on August 28.

Members of three eastern squads - Fordham, Georgetown, and Boston college, which participated in bowl contests last New Year's day — were among the choices of the coaches. Leading players on the strong Cornell and University of Pennsylvania elevens also were listed.

Carl Snavely of Cornell university; Lou Little, Columbia, and Emerson W. "Spike" Nelson, new coach at Yale university, were among the easterners selecting teams to meet the Bears. They were joined by four midwestern coaches-Maj. "Biff" Jones, Nebraska; Don Faurot, Missouri; Tom Stidham, Marquette, and Charles Bachman, Michigan State.
