

A GOOD TIME TO QUIT HOW many times have you said: I'm through with the game-for life? If you haven't, how many friends have you heard say it? Usually these come after a disastrous set, when somebody has overwhelmed your optimistically bid contract. But also you will usually find the same fellow, or girl, back at the game again be-fore long. Once in a great while you can't blame a player for saying that, and there is at least one case on record of a player who has kept his word for eight years and gives every evidence of sticking to it. He won't even kibitz a game, since what happened to him


