Currently at the Majestic theatre is the Charlie Chaplin comedy, "The Great Dictator," with "Heroes in Blue," starring Dick Purcell.

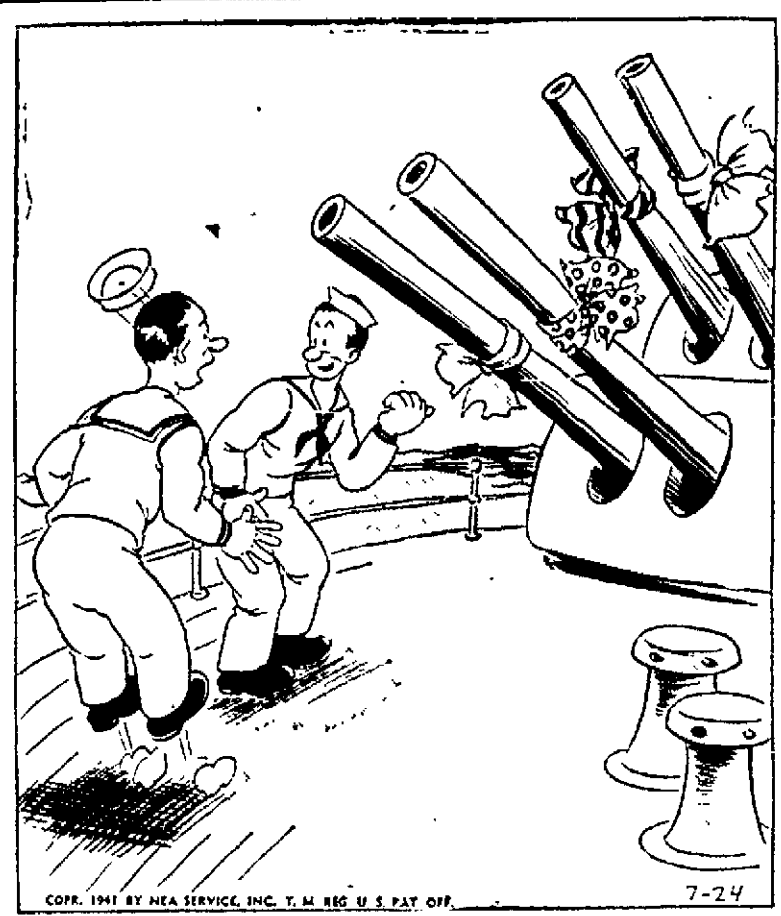

That flashing-eyed senorita, Lana Romay, will give "Daddy" a real workout in "Cugat Rumba Real" Thursday at 6:30 p. m.

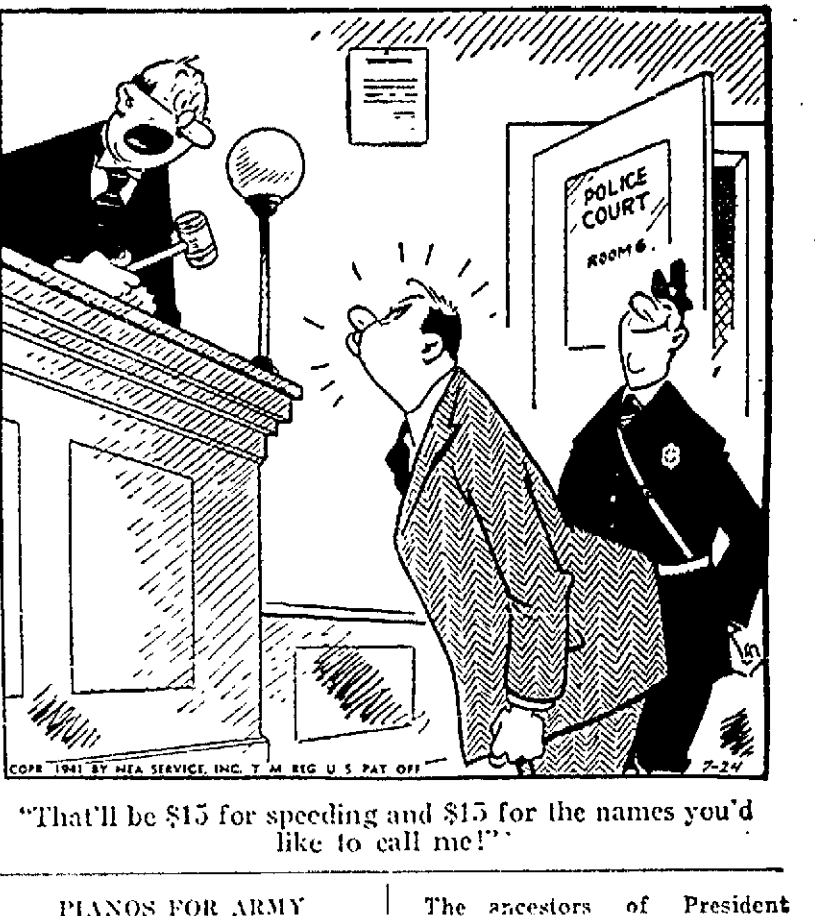
