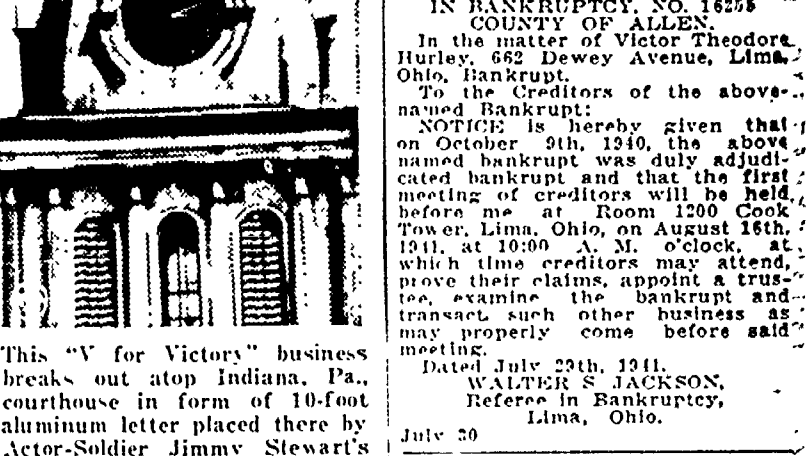

TRAIN WRECKING PLOT ARREST BARED BY F. B. I.

HUNTINGTON, W. Va., July 30 (AP)—T. K. Cook of the Huntington office of the federal bureau of investigation said a 24-year-old West Virginia man was arrested on a federal warrant charging that he attempted to wreck a freight train carrying national defense materials from Charleston to Hobson, near Pomeroy, O. Cook in announcing the arrest of Clyde Hayman, 21, of Ambrosia, Mason-co., said the attempt to wreck the train, a New York Central freight, occurred near Pleasantville, July 24. Hayman was taken into custody for questioning the day after a 50-gallon steel oil drum was found on the tracks, Cook said.
