He saw two in spades, one each in the red suits and four in clubs, a total of eight. Needing only one more to make his contract, he decided to try the heart finesse, so took the opening spade trick in dummy and led to the heart Q. It lost to the K. Back came the second spade, South taking East win, and taking the third, discarding a diamond from his own hand. No matter what he did, he had no way now to gain that vital ninth trick, so was down one.

While aspirin, sugar and minute quantities of salt were fairly good, they did not keep flowers as long as did plain water, said Howell, who supervised the experiment. "Acetic acid was the poorest, causing cut flowers to wither immediately."
