Featured with Lynne Roberts and Ted North in the fine cast of 'The Bride Wore Crutches' are some top-notch screen personalities. Edgar Kennedy of the famous "slow-burn" has a fine role as a comic police captain while Robert Armstrong is on the other side of the law—a smooth gangeter. Lionel Stander is "Flannelmouth" Moroni, gunman extraordinary, and Richard Lane is the high-pressure managing editor.

One of the most exciting stories in American fiction springs into vivid, powerful reality on the screen of the Ohio theatre in "The Shepherd of the Hills."
