Farm Equipment Union Protests UAW Annexation

CHICAGO (U.P.)—Grant Oakes, chairman of the Farm Equipment Workers Organizing Committee, Congress of Industrial Organizations, said that the FEWC would not relinquish jurisdiction over its 39,000 members to the CIO United Automobile Workers. In a telegram to the UAW convention at Buffalo, where the UAW changed its name to include farm implement workers, Oakes said it was up to the general CIO convention, not to an individual union, to settle jurisdictional problems. Italians Report Mass Trek of Russ Civilians

ROME (U.P.)—Almost 25,000, 000 persons are today making the greatest known mass migration in history as a result of the Russo-German war, according to dispatches in the Italian press. Telegrams from the Russian front and from Ankara and Istanbul by the press and other reporting eyewitnesses from travelers leaving Russia appear to confirm reports that the entire civilian population is being evacuated from the whole of the Ukraine, from most of northwest Russia and from central Russia to several hundred kilometers east of Moscow. In the evacuation areas only hasty workers in war industries and expert saboteurs are being left behind. Everyone not directly contributing to one of these vital services must go. In parts where crops already have been harvested not a single civilian can be found for miles. Where crops have not been gathered, agricultural workers are remaining behind until after the harvest, with saboteurs standing by to destroy the crops in case the Germans should advance before they can be gathered. In cities including Moscow, these reports say that only war industries and essential services are functioning. Stories of travelers coming out of Russia indicate that the gigantic evacuation is not being carried out by any long-planned system but by hastily improvised after the initial German successes in Poland and the Baltic states, where most of the civil populations were left behind. Goal Is Ural In order to avoid the calamities which befell the French and Belgian armies, which often were delayed by days in getting to assigned positions because of refugees clogging the roads, Soviet authorities have given strict orders that

Nazis Claim 340,000 Tons of Shipping

BERLIN (U.P.)—Germany's air and sea war against Britain has sunk 340,000 tons of British shipping within a week and blocked "for days or weeks" at a time the Suez canal, slender link between the western and eastern halves of the British empire, an authorized spokesman said Friday night. German planes have bombed Egypt 40 times since May 17, he said, and are once more increasing the destruction of Atlantic shipping, in cooperation with Nazi submarines, despite preoccupation with the Russian war.

Week's Toll High Britain has lost 340,000 tons of shipping within the last week, he said, including 46,500 tons sunk and 28,000 tons more severely damaged and "considered lost" from a heavily guarded convoy. The newest major loss was announced earlier by the high command. An official news agency report said German bombers battered the Great British naval base at Alexandria Thursday night, scoring several heavy caliber hits on a floating dock and damaging it severely. An extremely heavy bomb hit a destroyer during the attack, the agency said, and a few minutes later a second explosion on the ship was heard, "sealing the ship's fate."

Suez Raids Listed Since May 17, the spokesman said, German long range bombers have raided Port Said six times, Alexandria 13 times, British air fields in Egypt five times, and miscellaneous objectives 10 times. Only four German planes were lost in the 40 attacks, he claimed. He reported the British now have "extraordinarily strong" anti-submarine defenses in the Atlantic but claimed these could not keep the British shipping losses for the past week from being more than three-fourths their ascertained losses of 408,000 tons for the entire month of July.

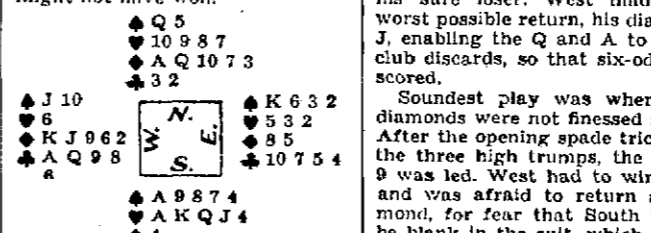
Rewey Girl's Eye Rolls Up—and Stays; It's Better Now

GIVE UP A SURE LOSER GRANTING that you have ample protection, by means of trumps in the case of a suit contract and by satisfactory stoppers in the case of a No Trumper, the deliberate giving up of a certain losing trick is usually better bridge than leading for a finesse. If the desired defender has to win the sure loser, he may be obliged to lead into your tenace position, and thus make the building of another trick for you unavoidable, whereas the finesse might or might not have won.
