



BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE GENERAL HEALTH DISTRICT OF ALLEIN COUNTY, OHIO:

That an ordinance entitled: "Ordinance to measure the part of the control of the con

ALLEN COUNTY, OHIO:
That an ordinance entitled: "Ordinance to prevent the spread of contagious diseases in restaurants, soft drink stands, tourist camps, heer gardens, saloons, hotels, night clubs, taverns, gas stations and other public places for the sale of food, drinks or intoxicating liquor", passed January 10, 1938, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. That before any person shall deliver, handle or serve food, drinks, or intoxicating liquor in a soft drink stand read.

Scciion 1. That before any person shall deliver, handle or serve food, drinks, or intoxicating liquor in a soft drink stand, resturant, fourist camp, hotel, beer garden, night club, saloon, tavern, gas station or other public place in the general health district of Allen County. Ohio, he shall first procure a certificate from the Health Commissioner of the General Health District of Allen County. Ohio, as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. Every such person applying to the Board of Health for a certificate, shall first be given a complete physical examination by a competent physician, including a blood test for spyhilis, and such examining physician shall fill out all of the blanks on the forms prescribed by the Health Commissioner for such physical examination. Other tests shall be made if deemed necessary by the physician or the Health Commissioner.

That the written report of the physical examination of such examing physician shall be submitted to the Health Commissioner by the examination of such examing physician shall be submitted to the Health Commissioner by the examination of such examing physician laboratory reports attached thereto, and if the Health Commissioner deems necessary, such Commissioner may physically examine such person further.
