

Richard Arlen Plays Lead Role In New Sigma Picture

"Forced Landing" Is Up To The Minute Story Of Defense Effort; "The Get-Away" Is Second Film On Bill

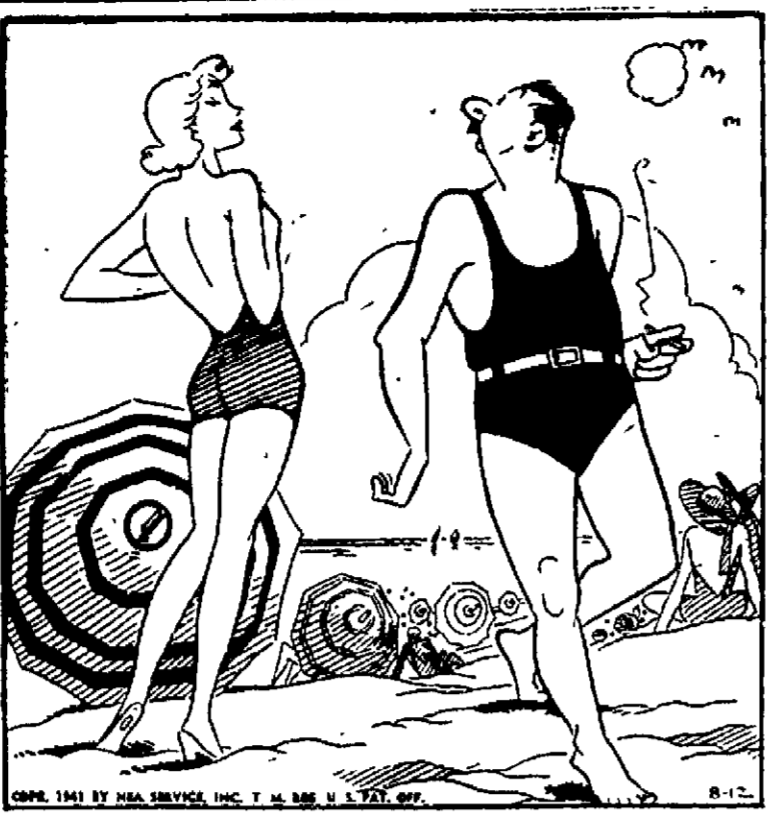

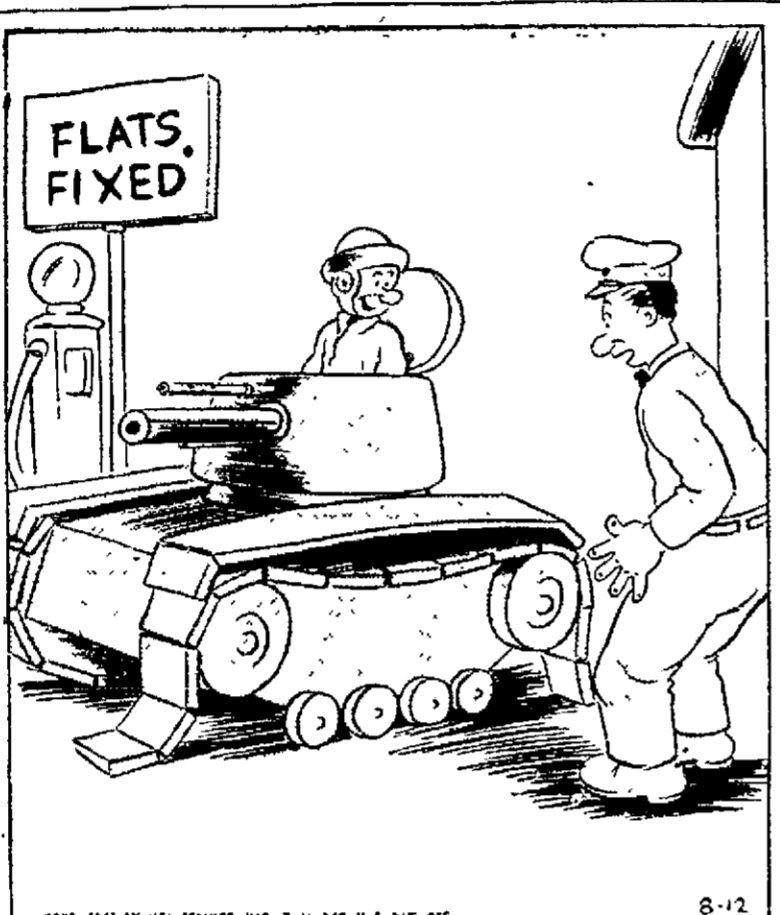
Starring Richard Arlen, the cast includes J. Carroll Nash, Eva Gabor, Nils Asther, John Miljan and Evelyn Brent.

5 RESCUED FROM SMALL ISLAND IN LAKE HURON

SOUTHAMPTON, Ont., Aug. 12 (AP)—Five persons who leaped into Lake Huron from their crippled cruiser and waded to a tiny island were brought here today.

They were Capt. Edwin T. Hamilton, formerly of Cleveland, an author and now resident of Stokes Bay, Ont.; Mrs. Kathleen Shem and her two children, Arlan, 14, and Thomas, 13, of Cleveland, and Jack Smith, Stokes Bay seaman.

Shortly after the party set out from here yesterday morning for Stokes Bay in the cabin cruiser "Dolly Dean," a crankshaft broke and the boat began drifting. Another ship spotted the disabled craft late yesterday and tossed a line, but this broke and the "Dolly Dean" was swept out of sight by a heavy wind.

The rescue boat returned later with a new line and sighted the five on the island, to which Capt. Hamilton explained they had waded when the wind tossed the ship toward the shore.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "ORDINANCE TO PREVENT THE SALE OF CONTAGIOUS DISEASES IN RESTAURANTS, NIGHT CLUBS, BEER GARDENS, SALOONS, HOTELS, GAS STATIONS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES FOR THE SALE OF FOOD, DRINKS OR INTOXICATING LIQUORS," PASSED JANUARY 1938.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE GENERAL HEALTH DISTRICT OF ALLEN COUNTY, OHIO: That an ordinance entitled "Ordinance to prevent the spread of contagious diseases in restaurants, saloons, beer gardens, night clubs, taverns, gas stations and other public places for the sale of food, drinks or intoxicating liquor," passed January 10, 1938, and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. That before any person shall deliver, handle or serve food, drinks or intoxicating liquor in a soft drink stand, restaurant, tourist camp, hotel, beer garden, night club, saloon, gas station or other public place in the general health district of Allen County, Ohio, he shall first obtain a certificate from the Health Commissioner of the General Health District of Allen County, Ohio, as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. Every such person applying to the Board of Health for a certificate, shall first be given a complete physical examination by a physician, and such a blood test for syphilis, and such a urinalysis, and such a chest x-ray, as shall be required by the Health Commissioner for such physical examination.

Section 3. The report of the physical examination shall be submitted to the Board of Health, or by the examining physician with the original laboratory reports to the Board of Health, and the Health Commissioner shall, if such physical examination of such person is satisfactory to the Board of Health, issue a certificate of health to the person so examined. It shall be the duty of such person containing in such employment in the district of Allen County, Ohio, to undergo a physical examination in the manner herein provided and secure a new certificate of health from the Health Commissioner of Allen County, Ohio, if such certificate expires or is otherwise annulled or is otherwise annulled or is otherwise annulled.

Section 4. This order and regulation shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest possible date of its adoption.
