MARRIAGE MART BREAKS RECORDS IN VAN WERT-CO

(Special To The Lima News) VAN WERT Aug. 19.—Three all-time records for the issuance of marriage licenses in Van Wert-co have been shattered—those for a single day, one month and a year.

During Saturday, the final date for couples to obtain licenses without physician's reports, Judge Charles E. Lawhead issued 17 licenses, more than double any other single day total in at least the past 25 years.

The previous high was established last Thursday when eight couples were issued licenses. During the first 16 days of the current month, 638 licenses were issued, nine more than ever issued before during one month. To date, 275 licenses have been issued, which is approximately more than the yearly average for the past two decades.

ADDITIONS MADE TO TWO SCHOOLS IN PUTNAM-CO

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, Aug. 19.—When the 1911-12 school terms opens Sept. 2 in Putnam-co there will be two new building additions ready for occupancy.

At Kalida the new \$55,000 auditorium-gymnasium will be ready for use, according to Supt. Gaylord Meyers. This building addition will enable Kalida high school to engage in basketball for the first time in the history of the school.

Henry Douvanian of Lima has been named coach and will greet the first class candidates of this school in October. This will make a total of 13 high school squads competing for basketball laurels during the 1911-12 season.

The other new building is at Continental where a shop annex is being constructed. This structure is almost finished but is not expected to be ready for occupancy until a few weeks after the new term begins, according to Supt. H. G. Wetherby.
