Shortly after she graduated from high school her parents moved to Pasadena, Calif., where Marie entered the widely famed Pasadena Community playhouse.

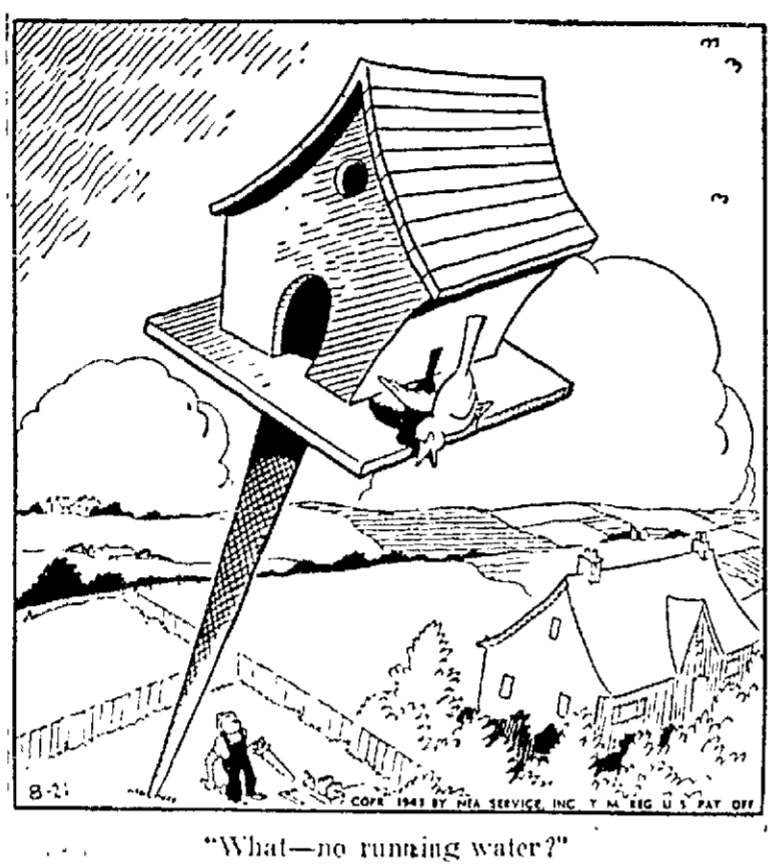

PILOT'S SCHOOL FOR FERRY JOBS GROWS RAPIDLY

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Aug. 21 (AP)—The nation's only school for training pilots in ferrying war planes to Britain is growing so rapidly that a class of 100 graduates monthly has become the goal of its directors.

Pilots with a minimum of 750 flying hours come to the Eazle Nest flight center which was formed by the Transcontinental and Western Air, Inc., with the support of the War Department.

The pilots receive intensive training for the ferry pilot jobs. Capt. Otis Bryan, former army flier and general manager of the Eagle Nest, said the money isn't the only reason the school has a long waiting list of applicants.

"Some of these men have left good airline jobs and other good paying jobs to get instruction in big ship piloting which is not available anywhere else in the country," he said.

War Correspondent To Tell Of Experiences While Prisoner In Nazi-Held France

The Aldrich Family, radio's favorite dramatic comedy series which went off the air last month topping all programs in the official ratings, returns to WEAJ for the fourth season as an air feature Thursday.

In three seasons of radio life, the Aldrichs, who are just like your neighbors down the block, have been accepted by the American public as has no other dramatic group in the history of broadcasting.

The family consists of Henry (Ezra Stone), the well-meaning youngster who courts trouble with abandon; Samuel Aldrich (House Jameson), father, head of the family and local attorney-at-law; Mrs. Alice Aldrich (Katharine Rahl), the mother; and Mary (Charita Bauer), the pretty sister.

Jay Allen, American war correspondent who has just returned to the United States after four months imprisonment by the Nazis in Occupied France, will be Rex Stout's guest on "Speaking of Liberty," Thursday. The WEAJ program will be heard at 5:30 p. m.

Allen covered Europe for many years as correspondent for the Chicago Tribune, the Chicago Daily News, and the North American Newspaper Alliance.
