THE HAND IS WORTHLESS. DID YOU ever bid one of a suit over your partner's opening bid of a lower-ranking suit, and then, after he bid one of a still higher-ranking suit, pass on your next turn? You never did that with a good hand, did you? Wasn't your only purpose, in bidding at all, the hope that he might name something else which you could bid better, since his first call had been your shortest suit? If the opponents, after that, get into the bidding, and your partner finally doubles their contract, are you going to take it out because your hand is worthless on the defense? Of course not. You have already told him your hand is lacking in honor strength, and his business or penalty double must be based entirely on what he thinks he can do without any help from you.

Ex-Lawyer Must Rebuild Ruined Life

DENVER (U.P.)—Dapper Berte Benjamin Laska, ex-lawyer, faces his new problem, the adjustment of an ex-convict to a normal life. The 69-year-old man who became famous when accused of hypnotizing a trial witness, served four years and 10 months of a 10-year sentence for accepting ransom for a defending Albert Bates, kidnaper.

Early in life the boy who became a famous criminal lawyer showed his ability at dramatics. At 7 he appeared in vaudeville. While blindfolded he chiseled busts of Washington and Lincoln out of stone.

When 14 on a road trip the lad who was reared in East New York visited Colorado Springs and then made up his mind to live in the Rocky mountain area.

Three years later in Galveston, Tex., an attorney asked him to hypnotize a witness to get "the true story."

Newspaper accounts say the attempt was successful—at least the man was acquitted by a jury on the basis of his testimony.

Graduated at Ann Arbor. After traveling for several years, Laska enrolled at the University of Michigan. He was graduated at 26 and came to Colorado and passed the bar examination in 1907.

Within a year he was accused of hypnotizing witnesses at trials. A commission of three attorneys—appointed by District Judge Robert E. Lewis—investigated and exonerated him.

The results increased the prestige of the youthful attorney and broadened his practice. Criminal lawyers from all sections of the country visited him.

His career skyrocketed and soon Laska was Denver's most prominent lawyer. During the prohibition era he charged he was taken by the Ku Klux Klan to a cemetery, severely beaten and warned "cut out defending these bootleggers."

On June 15, 1933, Laska reached a new high in his career—he won the acquittal of Mrs. Verne Sankey and her sister, Mrs. Ruth Kohler, in connection with the kidnaping of Charles Boettcher, II, scion of a wealthy Colorado family.

Bates Case Next. A month later came the kidnaping of Charles F. Urschel, the Oklahoma City oil man whose ransom totaled \$196,000.

Bates, one of the suspects, "holed-up" in Denver, and was arrested for questioning in connection with another case. Police found part of the ransom money in his possession and charged him with kidnaping.

Laska defended Bates in Oklahoma City that September but the kidnaper was sent to "the Rock," Alcatraz, for a life term. Meanwhile, Federal Bureau of
