STORIES IN STAMPS

Denmark Is Hard Hit By German Occupation

DENMARK'S commercial shipping, symbolized by the well-known ancient caravel stamp design above, is practically at a standstill, victim of Hitler's war.

Forces of national income, the Danish fleet is now reduced to one-third its 1939 size.

Many Danish ships were caught in neutral ports when war broke out; one-third of the fleet was pressed into British service. The remainder, in Danish ports, lacks opportunity for profitable service.

German occupation is plunging Denmark deep into debt, forcing industry into decline and increasing unemployment. Factories, unable to obtain raw materials, face shutdowns. Unemployed Danes are being moved into German industries.

The livestock industry, once source of Denmark's principal exports, has been hit by lack of feed-stuffs. Cattle are living on acorns, fish by-products, chestnuts, heather, kitchen scraps. Stocks of pigs must be cut 50 per cent, poultry 75 per cent. Reduction in cattle herds has already caused a decline in milk and butter production.

Denmark's cost of living, meanwhile, has risen steadily. Price increases have been among the highest in continental Europe.

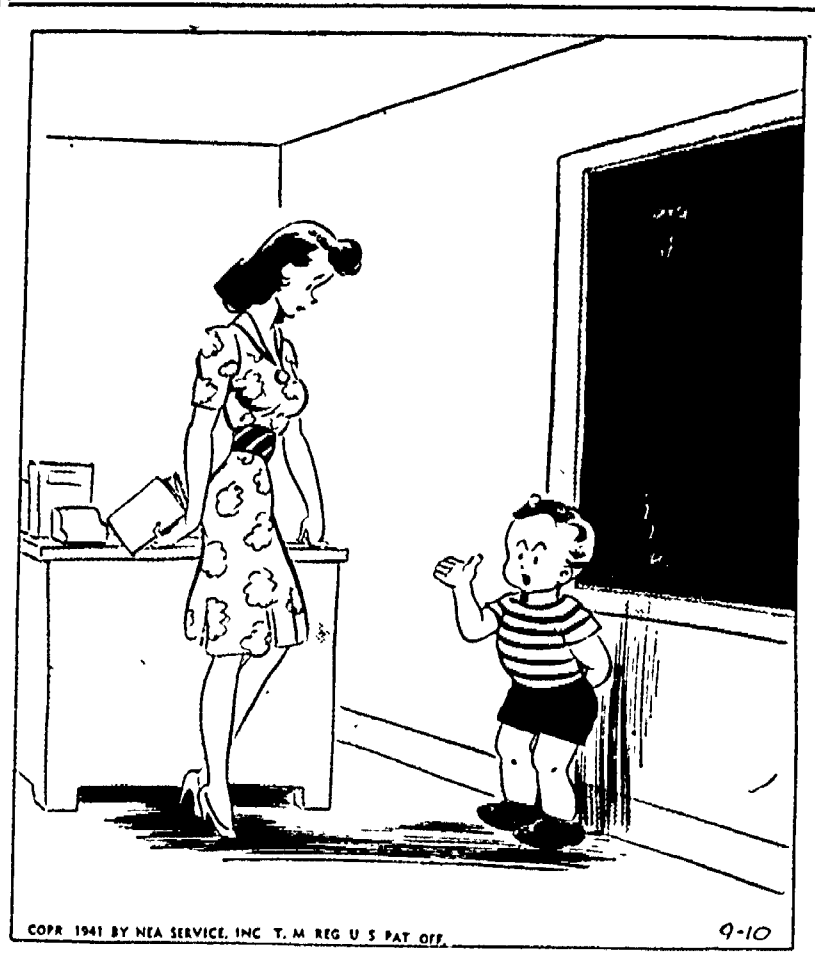

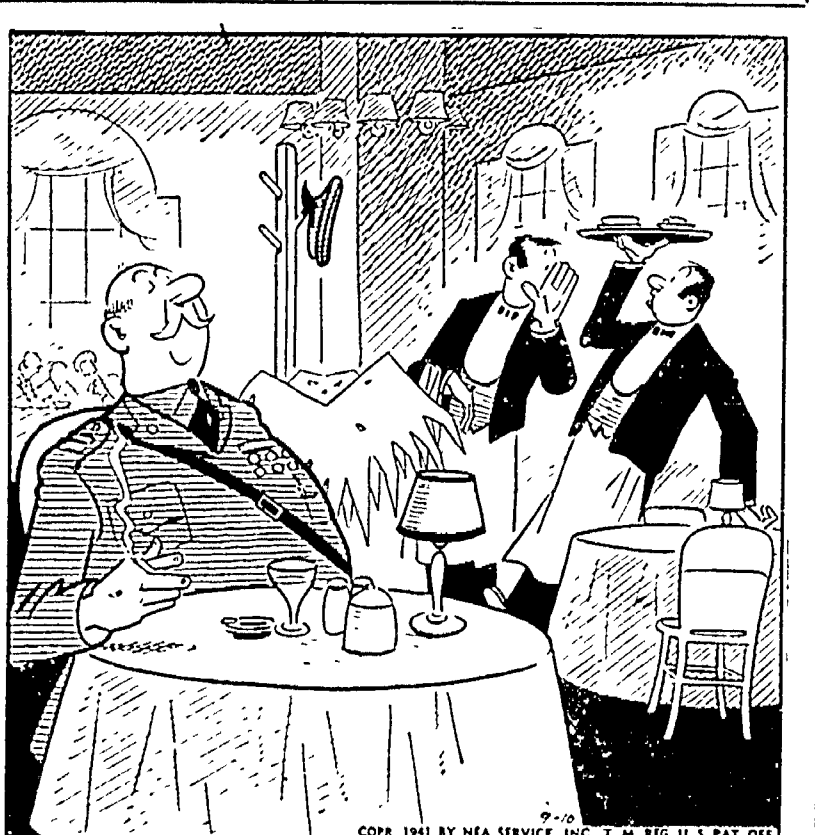

John Hubbard is the normal, straight away type of unassuming young American who insists that nothing worth recording ever happens to him. Still, at 28 years of age, he has appeared in more than a hundred stage plays, been a successful salesman, had important roles in half a dozen major pictures. He also has a long term contract with Columbia Pictures and is regarded by many as Hollywood's prime hope among younger leading men.

Born in Georgetown, Ill., his real name is Jack Hubbard. He was actually christened Jack. He attended public schools, participating in every activity from the debating team to the glee club. As a singer, he was a member of the National Chorus, which was composed of 500 of the best voices from among all American high schools.
