FAVOR THE 4-4 SUIT A MAJOR suit containing four cards in your hand and the same number in your partner's usually is the best declaration in which to play a deal, whether at a low contract or a high one, and regard-less of whether the game be rubber bridge er duplicate. A longer suit, containing the same total number of cards between the two hands, usually is better to have on the side to furnish discards. Seldom should No Trump be pre-ferred if you have any distribution other than the balanced 4-3-3-3.

In each of these cases the lead was the diamond 9 to the 10, K and A. Followed then the spade K, A and Q, whereupon a trick was given up to the spade J and the rest of the tricks were won for a total of four in spades, four in hearts, three in diamonds and one in clubs. Note that it would have been unsound for the declarer, with seven spades, to finesse against the J.

Where North, holding four cards of his partner's heart suit, went to 6-Hearts, he took all of

the tricks. He was able to ruff the fourth spade and won an obliga-tory diamond finesse, a club having been led originally.

The heart declarers made seven,


