

Stage Show Booked At The Ohio Thursday And Friday

"Broadway Limited" To Be Screen Fare As Flesh Attraction Takes Over; New Double Bill For The State

On the Ohio theatre stage Thursday and Friday will be the laugh riot production, "Crazy Show," featuring Shaw and Lee. Described as the zaniest and craziest "nutfest" of the day, this stage bit will feature many of the nation's best stage actors and actresses. "Broadway Limited," will be on the screen. "Alamo of the South Seas," will show thru Wednesday.

Commencing Thursday at the State will be "Underground," a timely picture, and "Power Dive," a thrilling air story. "They met in Bombay," featuring Clark Gable and Rosalind Russell, will end Wednesday. Continuing at the Quilna are "Wild Geese Calling," and "Dressed to Kill." Henry Fonda and lovely Joan Bennett are seen in the first hit which deals with Stewart Edward White's story of the north-west. Lloyd Nolan, as Detective Mike Shayne, walks in to double murder on his wedding day in the latter hit. "Belle Starr," will show at the Friday night preview.

Herbert Marshall and Virginia Bruce have many thrills in the Lyric's "Adventure in Washington," which shows thru Thursday. Completing the great program is "Bringing Up Baby," a laugh packed hit with Katharine Hepburn.

Excitement is served up in generous helpings in the Sigma's "Dude Cowboy," starring Tim Holt, with Marjorie Reynolds and Roy Whitey. The second picture on the bill is "Highway West." "Raffles," and "Alias the Bad Man," will start Thursday at the Majestic.

LYRIC
An uproarious style of screen courtship is previewed in Lyric hit "Bringing Up Baby." Katharine Hepburn and Cary Grant, last co-starred in "Philadelphia Story," principals in the novel love affair, set a dozen precedents, for the average couple most of these are not recommended.

The romantic initiative is taken by Miss Hepburn, and the unsuccessful fleeing by Grant. The methods Miss Hepburn uses to hag her quarry are singularly unique. Her first trick consists of enlisting Grant's aid to transport a leopard from New York to Connecticut. Later, she employs a dog to hold Grant's attention, while she hides his clothes to prevent his return to the city to carry out his original plan of marrying Virginia Walker,

his secretary. Each time Grant seems on the point of escaping, Miss Hepburn conceives a new scheme to hold him, and before the picture reaches its happy conclusion the two have landed in jail, stolen an automobile, stoned an innocent man, posed as circus entertainers and met with dozens of other madcap adventures.

Charlie Ruggles, May Robson, Barry Fitzgerald, Walter Catlett and Fritz Field also figure prominently in these escapades, with a large supporting cast to help pile up the merriment.

Columbia's "Adventure in Washington," new dramatic adventure story starring Herbert Marshall and Virginia Bruce, ends its successful run at the Lyric theatre on Thursday. The film, directed by Alfred E. Green, features Gene Reynolds, new young star. Also important in the supporting cast are Samuel S. Hinds and Ralph Morgan.

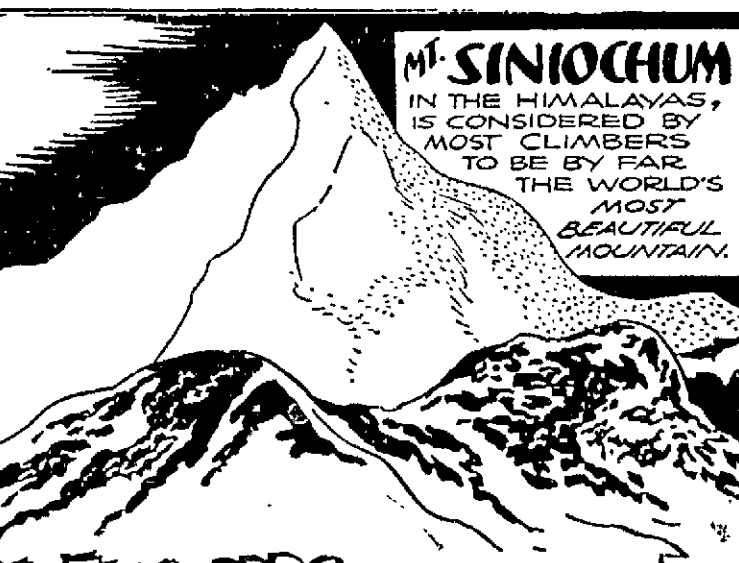
