53 Years Experience Makes Bus Co. Man Real Transport Expert!

When you're doing a good job—keep on doing it. That might be the motto of William Neff, for 53 years have gone by since he first started working on maintenance of public transportation equipment. Bill, as he is called by friends and fellow employees, is in charge of welding operations in the garage of the Madison Bus Company.

in 1888. He was just a youngster then, for he took up his job in Madison in 1894 before he was 21. He built and maintained all the electric distribution system of the Madison Railway Company from 1894 until the street cars stopped operating in February, 1935. Many Madisonians will recall the sixteen-ton snowplow, mounted on a huge street-car chassis. Mr. Neff supervised the building of the plow in his own shop, and did much of the work; it was so wide that in clearing Mills Street, the snow was piled up till it covered the sidewalks.

His work of the old street-car days also included the welding of rails as well as installation of overhead wiring. Bill has nothing but admiration for the company's present shops, where he still works. "These buses have got to be right, or they don't go on the streets," he emphasizes. "The shop foreman and his whole crew are doing a swell job, and truly insuring the safety of every rider!"

"Of course, I haven't been in Madison so long—only 47 years," Bill chuckles. "I guess that makes me the senior employee of the line, as compared with some of the kids who have only been here 20 or 30 years." Mr. Neff started in the business as a lineman with the street car company in Rockford,
