

JURISDICTION OVER UTILITY FIRM IS DENIED

Federal Court Rules Against Ohio Public Utilities Commission

COLUMBUS, O., Oct. 3—(AP)—A three-judge federal court held today that the Ohio utilities commission had no jurisdiction over the United Fuel Gas Co. of West Virginia, which supplies gas to Portsmouth, O.

The National Gas Act of 1938, the court said, gave the Federal Power Commission jurisdiction over gas companies engaged in interstate commerce.

The state commission had ordered the West Virginia company to supply information on its business that might help the commission in fixing an equitable rate for Portsmouth consumers.

United Fuel Gas sells gas to the Portsmouth Gas Co., which is appealing from a rate established by city ordinance in 1931 and extended to November, 1941.

The federal court, which received the case in 1935, restrained the state commission from enforcing its orders on the West Virginia firm.

Counsel for the commission had contended that Ohio had power to regulate rates charged by an out-of-state firm doing business in Ohio.

The commission's legal staff declined to comment on today's ruling or to speculate on the next procedure pending a thorough study of the decision.

The federal court consisted of District Judge Mell G. Underwood and Robert R. Nevin and Judge Florence Allen of the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals.



300 MORE WILL BE FURLoughed AT MANSFIELD

MANSFIELD, Oct. 3—(UPI)

Officials of the Mansfield Westinghouse plant said today that 300 additional workers at the plant will be laid off as the result of the Office of Production Management's decision reducing refrigeration production 40 per cent.

B. W. Clark, vice president in charge of merchandising at the plant, said that the "furlough" (effective Oct. 13) will bring to 1,000 the number of workers laid off because of curtailed production and shortages of vital materials.

Clark said he expected 700 workers to be re-employed when the plant begins production on a \$75,000,000 armament order.



