

Tyrone Power, Betty Grable Together In Quilna Feature

"A Yank In The R. A. F." Will Show At Friday Night Preview; Sigma Will Offer "International Squadron" Saturday

Tyrone Power is starred as the Yank in the new air thriller, "A Yank in the R. A. F." which will be shown at the Friday preview offering of the Quilna theatre. Betty Grable, as the American heroine who becomes a heroine, heads the featured cast which includes John Sutton and Reginald Gardiner. Showing for the last times Friday at the preview will be "Man Hunt" and "We Go Fast."

Another thriller of the R. A. F. is scheduled to open Saturday at the Sigma theatre when "International Squadron," starring Ronald Reagan, commences a four-day run. Also in the east are Olympe Bradna, William Lundigan, Joan Perry and Reginald Denny in a film concerning one of the most colorful units of Britain's flying armada.

Eleanor Powell, Ann Sheridan, Robert Young, John Carroll and Red Skelton poll a wealth of dancing, singing and acting talent in "Lady Be Good," which commences Saturday at the Ohio theatre. Showing Friday only is the stage presentation of Cab Calloway's "Cotton Club Revue," with the noted maestro of hi-de-ho offering a group of talented musicians that have been the toast of the entertainment world for several years.

The State theatre presents "One Night in Lisbon," with Fred MacMurray and Madeline Carroll in the starring roles of an American flyer and his British sweetheart and their adventures in a Europe teetering on the brink of war. Co-featured is "Scattergood Pulls the Strings," with Guy Kibbee in the title role of the benevolent character of fiction and movies.

Tom Tyler, Rufe Davis and Bob Steele, those Three Mesquiteers, hit the adventure trail again in their latest offering, "Outlaws of Cherokee Trail," currently at the Lyric theatre. Also showing is "Poison Pen," starring Flora Robson and Robert Newton in a thrilling suspenseful story based on an actual happening in a small English town a few years ago.

Lionel Barrymore and Edward Arnold are the two men vying for the control of a young lad's future in "The Penalty," with Gene Autry in "Melody Ranch" is the co-feature.

It is a really outstanding film, with action dominating the well paced story. And there are plenty of scenes that stand out — the Dunkirk evacuation, with the cast of thousands performing realistically to provide the year's top battle scene; the dog fights which were actually filmed by the R. Tyrone Power gives his finest performance as the bored Yank who is anxious to go into action. A brash, flippant young man, he again has the kind of role which demands — and gets — superb acting. And Betty Grable, in her first dramatic role, shows that she is tops as an actress. In addition to her dramatic scenes in which she excels, she sings and dances to two new hit tunes by Leo Robin and Ralph Rainger, "Hi-Ya Love"
