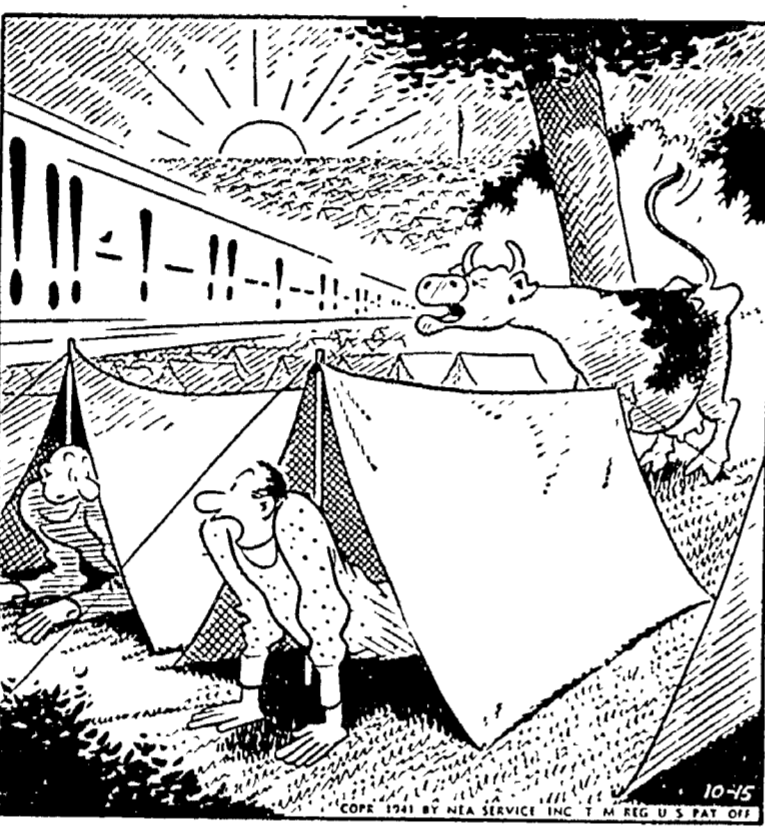

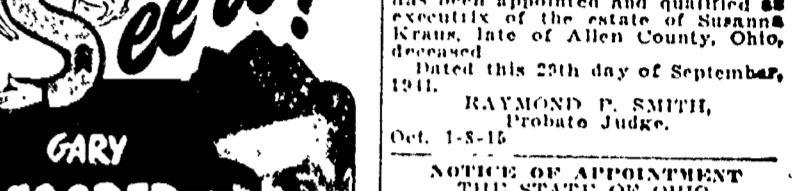

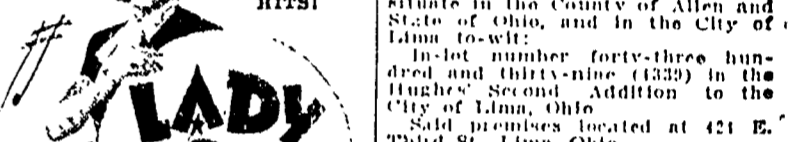

CLEVELAND, Oct. 15—(AP)—Cuyahoga county's 2,000 families have a second official ruling supporting their legal resistance to a new ordinance. Judge Frank S. Day held unconstitutional provisions limiting their stay to 30 days. Earlier the board of elections granted 75 residents of a Brookline village camp the right to register and vote provided they had lived at the same address at least 90 days and in the state a year.
