

Two Fast-Action Thrillers Open At The Lyric Tuesday

"Under Fiesta Stars" And "Hurricane Smith" Are Films; Gary Cooper In "Sergeant York" Is Ohio Offering

The attractions at the Lyric theatre commencing Tuesday are "Under Fiesta Stars" and "Hurricane Smith," a pair of dynamic adventure thrillers.

A sharp-shooting Tennessee mountaineer who made history in a remarkable exploit of the World war, is the role portrayed by Gary Cooper in "Sergeant York," now at the Ohio theatre.

Robert Montgomery, in one of the most unusual roles ever brought to the screen, is the star of "Here Comes Mr. Jordan," the picture now playing at the Quilna theatre.

Showing for the last times Monday at the Majestic are "Washington Melodrama" and "Robin Hood of the Pecos."

"Sergeant York," the film at the Ohio theatre, is the factual story of Alvin C. York, Tennessee mountaineer who became America's number one soldier hero of the first World war.

Gary Cooper stars in the title role of Alvin York. Walter Brennan and Joan Leslie, who plays Gracie Williams, the present Mrs. Alvin York, head the supporting cast of hundreds. Cooper was Sergeant York's own choice for the title role.

There are 44 major speaking parts. Twenty-six represent real life characters, most of whom are still living. The real life characters include four members of the York family; Gracie Williams; Pastor Pile, minister of York's church; the present Secretary of State, Cordell Hull; General John J. Pershing; the late Mayor John Hylan of New York; Oscar of the Waldorf; York's divisional, regimental, battalion and company commanders during the war and ten of his soldier buddies.

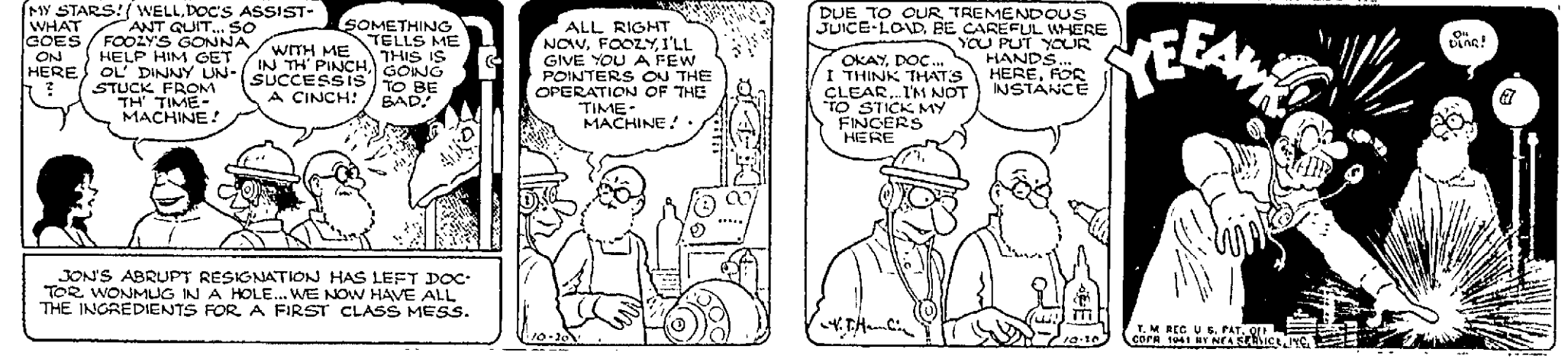
