Bonita Granville Has Lead In "Down In San Diego;" Second Hit Is "Bandit Trail" With Tim Holt Starred

Packed with action and romance, "Down in San Diego," is current at the Sigma with Bonita Granville, Ray McDonald and Leo Gorcey in the leading roles.

Gene Autry is as popular with his leading ladies as he is with his myriads of fans. They are all eager to return to the lot to be featured with the singing cowboy.

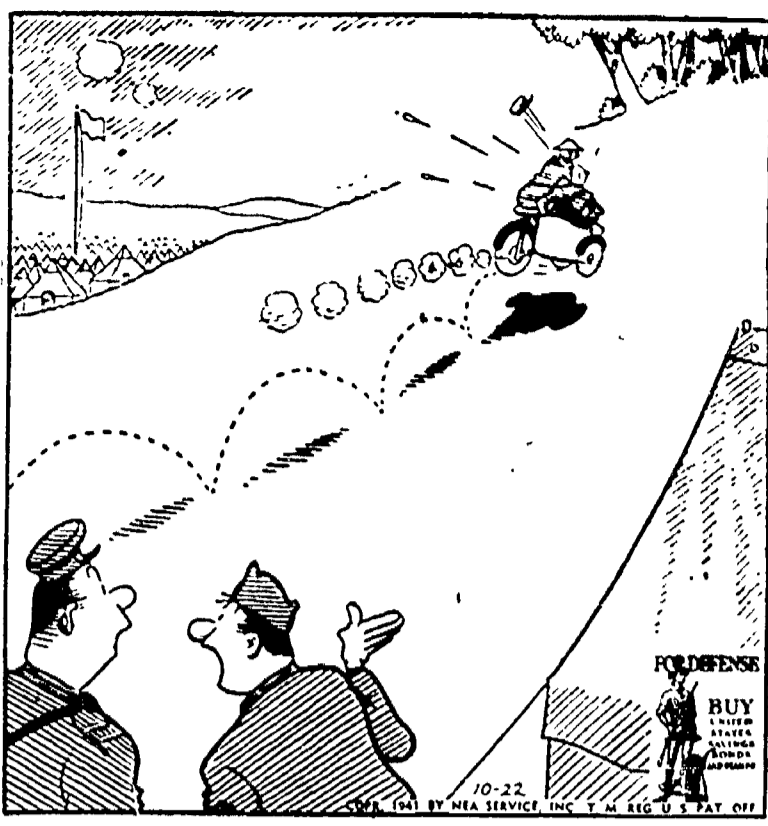
Carol Hughes, who was Autry's leading lady earlier in his latest film, "Under Fiesta Stars," which is at the Lyric theatre.

After deciding on the theatre for a career, Carol secured a job as usher in the State Lake theatre in Chicago.

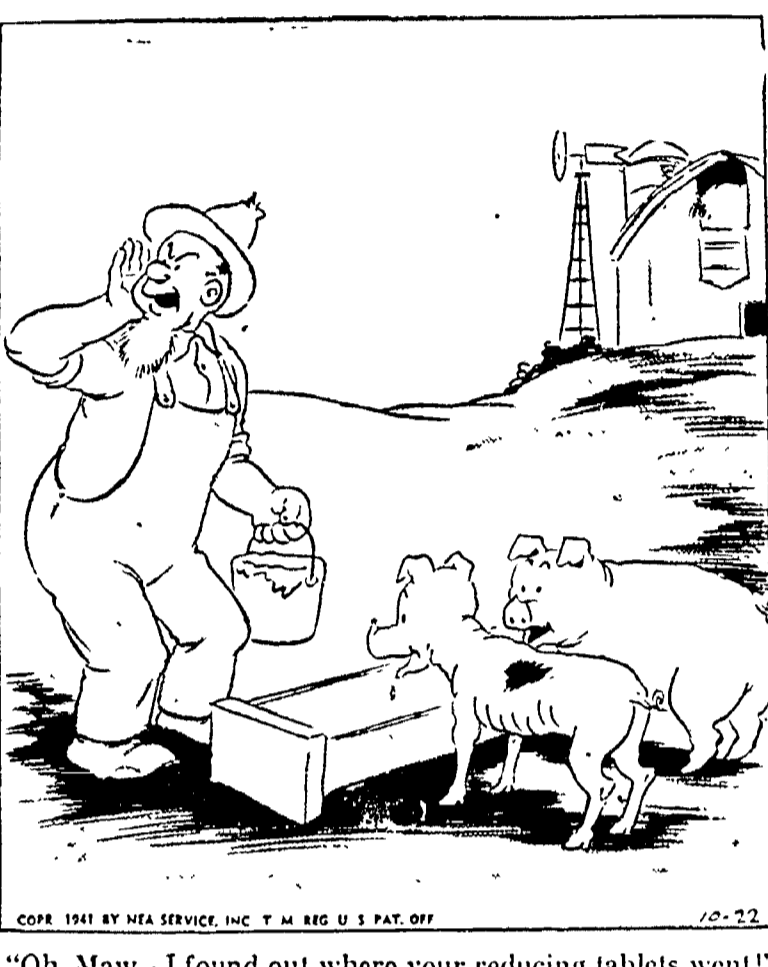

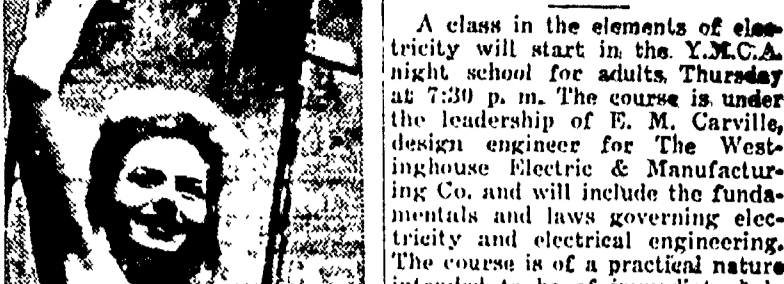
