

Newspaperman Finds Many Thrills In Sigma Picture

Great Western Production Now Current At The Ohio; Edward G. Robinson And George Raft In State Hit

"Nine Lives Are Not Enough," a picture filled with thrills and chills about news and clues, dames and danger, murder and mirth, opens Wednesday at the Sigma.

Clark Gable and Lana Turner are starred together for the first time in "Honky-Tonk," currently showing at the Ohio theatre.

Continuing to draw patrons to the Quilna is "Ice-Capades," a rollicking laugh riot featuring Jerry Colonna, James Ellison and Dorothy Lewis.

At the Lyric is "Our Wife," the laugh show of the season starring Melvyn Douglas, Ruth Hussey and Ellen Drew.

"Doctors Don't Tell," the favorite of radio and screen, also will show. Guy Kibbee portrays the lovable "Scattergood."

In "Honky-Tonk," starring Clark Gable and Lana Turner, now at the Ohio theatre, the principals will be supported by a cast whose players, without exception have established important places for themselves on the screen.

Frank Morgan, for instance, long has been one of Hollywood's brightest light-comedy stars for his work in "Paradise for Three," "The Great Ziegfeld," "Naughty Marietta" and "The Wizard of Oz."

On the other hand he has demonstrated his versatility in serious roles like that of the professor in "The Mortal Storm" or as shopkeeper in "The Shop Around the Corner."

In "Honky-Tonk" he takes the part of Judge Milton, a shady character in a Western frontier town.

Claire Trevor is a young actress who, as "Gold Dust" Nelson in "Honky-Tonk," offers another cool, sardonic characterization such as she made popular in "Big Town Girl," "Song and Dance Man" and "Dead End."

A graduate of the American Academy of Dramatic Arts, Miss Trevor is as much at home on the stage as on the screen.

Marjorie Main, who takes the part of an evangelist in this picture, is well known for her comic portrayals which have won her the rare accolade of being referred to as a second Marie Dressler.

Her most recent performance was in "Barnacle Bill," a co-starrer with Wallace Beery. Chill Willis abets Miss Main as Gable's side-kick, "The Sniper." Willis is a lanky Texan who has played in everything from medicine shows to night clubs.

Saturday night the ghosts walk, when chills and thrill and ghoulish, blood-curdling mysteries join hands, and spooks and spirits take a holiday.
