CHICAGO-(U.P.)-One glance at this week's National Football League statistics will indicate why Chicago's mighty Bears fear the

Green Bay Packers as no other club in the league.

When the Bears and Packers meet in Chicago before a record crowd of some 45,000 this Sunday, the Packers will throw into action the league's best passer, the best pass receiver, two of the best scorers, and the best field goal kicker. As usual, Cecil Isbell, Don Hutson, and Clark Hinkle of Green Bay continued to dominate these vital league statistics.

In 130 passes, Isbell has completed 76 for a total yardage of 989 and nine touchdowns. The only man in the league with a superior average completion is Philadelphia's Tommy Thompson, who holds second place with 43 completions in 76 attempts. Isbell has hit with as many as Thompson has thrown.

Parker Hall of Cleveland is third in passing with 55 successful tosses in 112 attempts for total yardage of 537. Sid Luckman of the Bears was rated fourth with 574 yards in 23 completions.

Hutson, who broke the league's all-time record for touchdowns with two against Detroit last Sunday, holds even more of an edge among pass receivers. He has caught 36 passes for 447 yards and five touchdowns. Perry Schwartz of Brooklyn, still his nearest rival, picked up 16 passes for 248 yards, and Lou Brock of Green Bay remained in third place with 15 passes caught for a total of 191 yards.

Hutson's 52 points lead the league in scoring and Hinkle is second with 35. George McAfee of the Bears moved into third place by 35 points. Included in Hinkle's scoring are four field goals in eight attempts which still leads New York's Ward Cuff. Cuff has made three in nine tries.
