GLASS BEAD PAINT PUT ON DIXIE IN EFFORT TO REDUCE ACCIDENT TOLL

Increased efforts on the part of the Ohio Department of Highways to curtail increased traffic accidents included the completion Thursday of centerlining Route 25 with glass bead paint, it was announced Friday by O. K. Kohli, division engineer.

John F. Wagner, division engineer in charge of traffic and safety announced the traffic accident rate in this division is 18 per cent.

The glass bead paint applied on the Dixie-hy, altho more expensive in initial cost, out-lasts the ordinary paint three to one, Kohli said. A total of 43 miles of state highway in the division is now centerlined with glass bead paint.

Route 25 now has the glass bead centerline throught the division, starting at the Auglize-co line and continuing north to the northern Hancock-co line.

More than 5,000 gallons of white paint, 5,000 gallons of black paint and 1,800 gallons of yellow paint have been used by the traffic and safety department to mark highways in the division since the first of the year.

The eight counties comprising Division 1 have more than 500 miles of solid centerline. More than 200 of the 3,000 bridges in the division will be marked with the next few days with glass reflector bridge end markers.

Figures released by Wagner indicate a 10-mile per hour increase in the average rate of speed since 1938, making the average rate 63 miles per hour.

Traffic accidents involving fatalities in the following counties were: Allen, 5; Defiance, 5; Hancock, 5; Hardin, 3; Paulding, 3; Putnam, 1; Van Wert, 3, and Wyandot, 3, most accidents occurring at intersections and curves.

Gov. John W. Bricker is constantly urging department officials to cooperate with local traffic agencies and the motoring public to use every effort to lower the increasing traffic toll, Wagner said.
