Grand Jury Plans to Quiz Magazine Men

WASHINGTON—(U.P.)—The grand jury investigation of foreign propaganda was in recess Saturday until next Wednesday when it hopes to question two top executives of Scribner's Commentator magazine about a "master mailing list" for anti-intervention literature.

Miss Feagin had been halled before District Court Judge James V. Morris for possible contempt action because of the mental "lapses" but her trial was continued to permit her to obtain counsel.

Thursday morning she reappeared, accompanied by Atty. Nicholas J. Chiacione who explained that he had advised Miss Feagin of the laws of perjury and laws relating to testimony before a grand jury, then announced that he was withdrawing from the case.

Miss Feagin asked a further delay "to see another lawyer" and was given until 2 p. m. to do so. When that deadline arrived, she told Judge Morris that she was "unable to find one" and went again before the grand jury.

According to a transcript of her two-hour testimony, she told the panel that she had taken part in compiling what Maloney called a "master mailing list" containing names of persons who had written isolationist congressmen.

San Francisco—(U.P.)—Secretary of Interior Harold Ickes eluded a subpoena served for the California assembly oil investigation committee, it was revealed Thursday.

The subpoena server called at the lobby of Ickes' apartment hotel, said he was a Federal Bureau of Investigation agent and asked to see Ickes. The desk clerk called Ickes, who told the main to wait and then telephoned the FBI office to find out why an agent had been sent to see him.

Leader Calls 'Guard' Step to Revolution

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn.—(U.P.)—A former captain of a "defense guard" organized by Minneapolis labor leaders testified Thursday that defendants charged with a "workers militia" to be used in overthrowing the United States government.

Roy Wieneke, a government witness in the trial of 28 persons charged with seditious conspiracy, said defendants told him the guard was "Leon Trotsky's idea."

Defendants are members of the Socialist Workers party, which was founded on Trotsky's doctrines. Wieneke said he was made a captain of the defense guard in command of eight men. He said Ray Rainbolt, a defendant, was a leader of the guard, which consisted of about 25 men.

Wieneke testified that Rainbolt told him the guard was "masquerading" as a defense force to prevent a threatened attack on union members by Fascist organizations, but that it had been organized as "the first step in a revolution."
