

Laughs Galore Promised In Two New Pictures At State

"Hold That Ghost" Features Abbott And Costello; Walt Disney's Cartoon, "The Reluctant Dragon" Also On Bill

Laughs galore will be found in "Hold That Ghost," which opens Thanksgiving Day at the State theatre. Bud Abbott and Lou Costello, with the Andrew Sisters, find many thrills in a haunted house. "The Reluctant Dragon," a Walt Disney production, also will be on the bill. Wednesday will be the final day for the showing of "Kiss The Boys Good-bye," and "Blossoms in the Dust."

Commencing Thanksgiving Day at the Ohio will be "They Died With Their Boots On," the story of General George Custer, a man who lived, fought and loved with all the power his soul possessed. Errol Flynn and Olivia DeHavilland have leading parts. "The Little Foxes," shows thru Wednesday.

At the Sigma is "Never Give a Sucker An Even Break," easily the most typical W. C. Fields comedy in many seasons and also one of the most hilarious films of the season. Others starred are Gloria Jean, Leon Errol and Franklin Pangborn. Also on the bill is "Outlaws of the Desert."

Romance, rhythm, thrills and comedy all have big parts in the technicolor attraction, "Week-end in Havana," current at the Quilna. This laugh-packed musical features lovely Alice Faye, handsome John Payne, Carmen Miranda, Portuagal star and Cesar Romero. Currently showing at the Lyric is "Blood and Sand," the dramatic story of a humble peasant who conquered Spain by becoming its most famous bull fighter, but, who in turn conquered by a beautiful hard-hearted temptress. It has been hailed as a perfect cast, but its most impressive point, say reviewers, is that each role is blended to provide a motion picture masterpiece.

SIGMA
W. C. Fields is back again, and that is welcome news to lovers of comedy. The famous laughmaker with the equally famous nose is starting this time in a new Universal comedy, "Never Give a Sucker An Even Break," at the Sigma theatre.

Fields is by no means the whole show in the film which boasts one of the most important supporting casts of the season, including the youthful singing star, Gloria Jean, along with Leon Errol, Butch and Buddy, Susan Miller, Franklin Pangborn, Charles Lang and Margaret Dumont.

"Never Give a Sucker An Even Break" purports to give an "inside picture" of the motion picture industry, inasmuch as Fields and most of the others appear as themselves. Fields, who betrays none other than the movie comedian, Fields, opens for the studio, bringing a story he hopes to sell to Pangborn, the producer.

In his wanderings around the studio, which in this instance is the huge Universal "lot" in Hollywood, Fields meets all his fellow players. Eventually he goes with them on a trip to Mexico aboard a highly futuristic airliner, and on a mountain top in the neighboring nation the story comes to an action-filled climax.

Fields, as usual, wrote his own screenplay, assuming for this chore the pen name of Otis Cribbelle. John T. Neville and Prescott Chaplin collaborated on the script and the picture was directed by Edward Cline, who has been the director of many previous Fields successes.

Gloria Jean, who plays Fields' ward, provides some of the best singing of her career with such well-known favorites as "Estrellita" and "Ochi Tchornia." Errol also is seen to advantage as Fields' friendly enemy in the movie studio.

"Never Give a Sucker An Even Break" is easily the most "typical" Fields comedy in many seasons and is rated one of his most hilarious films.

At the Ohio starting Thursday will be "They Died With Their Boots On," latest in the exciting films of the old west to take its place on the impressive list of Warner Bros. productions which uses that colorful era for its setting.

This picture stars Errol Flynn as General George Custer, telling the story of his life from the time of his entry to West Point until his memorable stand at the battle of Little Big Horn. All the tense drama and romance in his exciting life is captured in this epic film. It is the story of a man who lived, fought and loved with all the power his soul possessed.

The role of Custer is tailored to Flynn's measure. Custer had an unquenchable love for gallantry, color, and most of all adventure. It was his love for gallantry that made him a Civil War hero; and his love for adventure that caused him to blaze a trail of victory in the Indian warfare of the 1870's.

Charming Olivia de Havilland is co-starred with Flynn in the role of Beth Custer, his lovely wife who admired her husband's deeds but never lost track of the constant danger he faced. And indeed danger dogged his every step. After the Civil War he was given command of the 7th Regiment,

whose duty it was to keep order in the Dakota territories.

The Sioux were promised by Custer that the Black Hills would always be their territory. No white man would ever be permitted to encroach on their land. But a scheming saloon keeper and his cohorts cooked up a plan to outfox hundreds of people into the Black Hills. Custer had no alternative (even though he knew it meant certain death) than to protect these people. This led to the unforgettable bloody battle at Little Big Horn which left not a single survivor of Custer's army.

Raoul Walsh, who is noted for the many epic films he has directed, guided the production of "They Died With Their Boots On," and if past performances are any criterion, this film will certainly carry all the scope, excitement and romance that its theme conveys. In addition to Errol Flynn and Olivia de Havilland in the starring roles, the film features such fine supporting players as Gene Lockhart, Charles Grapewin, Regis Toomey, Stanley Ridges, Arthur Kennedy and many others. Wally Klein and Aeneas Mackenzie wrote the screen play.
