Good Listening: The Chicago Round Table

WILLIAMS Madison Branch, American Association of University Women The University of Chicago's Round Table, which started as an "educational" feature and was ignored by many listeners who considered that it must therefore be dull and academic, has recently become one of the most exciting half-hours on the air.

In a critical period like the present, discussions of timely issues are of course more dramatic, especially when carried on by persons who are constantly in the news. These experts are telling about the same issues which are inspiring heated arguments on every street corner. In listening to them we may get new information or a different interpretation which may cause us to change our opinions. Or we may have the comfortable feeling of having our point of view expressed by a man who can back it up with facts which have not been at our disposal.

Although the Round Table sounds entirely extemporaneous, each broadcast requires a great deal of preparation. About 10 days in advance the subject for discussion is chosen for timeliness and general interest. Then the "cast" is chosen, often from university specialists in the particular field, with at least one well-known outsider on each panel. These persons are questioned about their points of view so that the research staff can prepare an outline to balance the opinions and prevent the discussion from going too far afield.

After several preliminary discussions, the participants meet Sunday morning to run through their outlines informally. A recording of this session is played back so that the speakers can analyze their faults. When the time for the broadcast arrives the speakers are seated around a table (unfortunately triangular, not round) which is equipped with sponge rubber elbow rests to keep oratorical guests from working themselves away from the microphone.

The director, Sherman Dwyer, keeps the program moving swiftly by signalling the speakers with cards. These cards have been prepared in advance to take care of most of the contingencies in the program, and are illustrated with drawings to keep the guests from taking offense. Some are: "Keep your ELBOWS on the Table. (signed) Emily Post."

"Don't Be Polite! Interrupt."

"Do You Know a Joke? How Does It Affect Me?"

"Stress the American Angle!"

"Two Minutes is a Long Time. Don't Rush."

After the 30 minutes are over, the participants are usually so excited they find it hard to stop, and continue their argument informally, just like the rest of us.
