SOME OF the prettiest plays In the game are those which com bine a lead-throwing end-play with a squeeze. On a particular late trick, the unhappy choice is presented to a defender of picking one undesirable discard or an other. If he selects one, he teta himself be squeezed into a situa-tion in which a high card can be dropped by the declarer. If he tries the other, then he is thrown into the lead and must pitch back right into the laws of a tenace.




