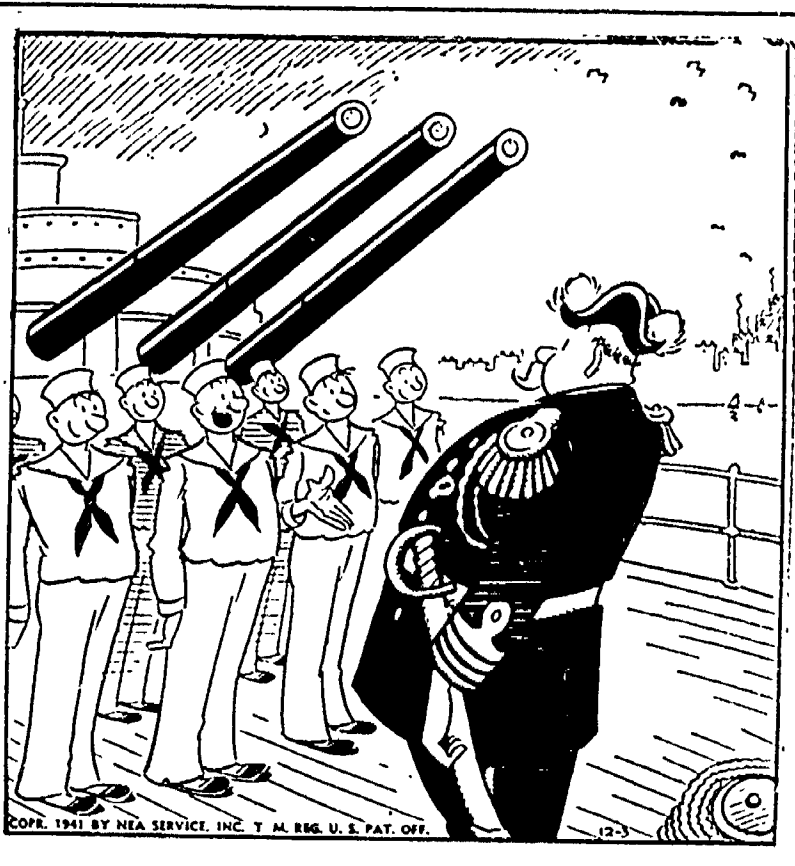

CREAMERY TO PAY FOR MILK SAT., DEC. 13

(Special To The Lima News) CELLINA, Dec. 3 — Officials of the Producers Creamery and Cold Storage Co. announced Wednesday it would distribute milk purchase payment checks on Saturday, Dec. 13, instead of waiting until Dec. 15, as is customary.

Purpose of the earlier payment is to place money in the hands of dairy farmers for use in making Christmas purchases. For the first half of November, the firm paid 805 patrons a total of \$12,342.42 on 669,772 pounds of milk.

Producers, which is making evaporated milk for foreign shipment, has sold six carloads, totaling 237,600 pounds, for use in England. The firm's two plants at Celina and Greenville currently are turning out 10,000 pounds of powdered milk daily, more than twice as much as a year ago, yet the demand is far from filled.
