Wisconsin Mutual Holders Will Pay 100 Per Cent 'Tax'

..A. 100 per cent assessment against policy holders of the Wis-consin Mutual Insurance co., now being liquidated, was ordered Tuesday by Circuit Judge A. C.

Hoppmann. The assessment, made to provide funds for paying off cred-itors and expenses of the liquidstion, is on premiums earned from Jan. 1, 1937, to Feb. 1, 1941. Total premiums earned in that period

is \$491,000. Liabilities of the company exceed assets for \$189,000. Liabilities amount to \$169,000, plus liquidation expenses of \$40,000. Assets are \$20,000.

Walworth Farmer Loses Damage Plea
