

New Tarzan Picture Due To Open At The Ohio Saturday

Johnny Weissmuller Again Cast In Title Role With Maureen O'Sullivan Supplying Feminine Interest

From the depth of the African jungles comes the story for the Ohio film, "Tarzan's Secret Treasure," commencing with the Saturday showing and starring Johnny Weissmuller and Maureen O'Sullivan as primitive mates of the wilds. Johnny Sheffield appears in the role of "Boy," supplying an appealing child interest.

The Quilna theatre preview Friday includes the latest Gene Autry film, "Down Mexico Way," which finds the musical cowpuncher riding into the heart of Mexico to expose a couple phony picture producers attempting to swindle good-hearted peeps. Co-featured will be "Sailors on Leave," starring William Lundigan and Shirley Ross. Concluding features are "Ladies in Retirement" and "Tillie the Toiler."

Commencing Saturday at the Sigma theatre is "Target For Tonight," scenes taken by R. A. F. cameramen during the course of bombing operations over a German city forming the background for an exciting air story. Also showing will be "Mob Town," starring Dick Foran and Anne Gwynne. Showing for the last times Friday are "Moonlight in Hawaii" and "Steel Against the Sky."

Based on the real life story of one of the west's most notorious characters, "Jesse James at Bay" provides thrills for Lyric theatre patrons. Roy Rogers is cast in the title role. Sally Payne and Gale Storm appear as newspaper girls of the gay nineties, with George "Gabby" Hayes as the sheriff who was once a friend of the famous bandit. Co-featured is "Let's Go Collegiate."

State films are "Down in San Diego," starring Bonita Granville, Dan Dailley, Jr., Henry O'Neill, Ray McDonald, Leo Gocey and Stanley Clements. Co-featured is "Three Sons O' Guns."

Currently at the Majestic theatre are "Sunset in Wyoming" and "Las Vegas Nights."

The first documentary film recording the R. A. F.'s answer to Hitler — motion pictures showing the planning and execution of an actual bombing raid on Germany — are incorporated in "Target for Tonight," a Crown Film Unit production made with the utmost cooperation of the Royal Air Force and presented Saturday at the Sigma.

American audiences have seen evidence of the heroic resistance of London's population to the nocturnal visits of Herman Goering's Luftwaffe in several newsreel compilations. But it has remained for "Target for Tonight" to show the reverse side of the coin — the R. A. F.'s steady pounding of the enemy's industrial centers and supply concentrations.

Climax of the film are the scenes taken by R. A. F. cameramen during the course of bombing operations over a German city identified as Freilhausen. The illumination of the earth below as the bomber's cargo hits the target of oil tanks is a spectacle to defy Hollywood's most resourceful technicians. Also exceptional are the shots showing the barrage of anti-aircraft fire.

All the "actors" in "Target for Tonight" are R. A. F. officers and men who enact the scenes of their daily duties. Thus the picture gives a close-up view of the character of the individual airmen who comprise that force which Winston Churchill eulogized when he said: "Never in the history of the world has so much been owed by so many to so few."

Once again that symbol of escape from city pavements and man-made laws, "Tarzan," makes his appearance on the Ohio screen in "Tarzan's Secret Treasure," with Johnny Weissmuller and Maureen O'Sullivan again cast as Tarzan and his bride of the jungle.

Marking the twenty-fifth anniversary of the filming of the first Tarzan production, the new picture presents a fascinating panorama of wild life in the jungle, with the exploits of his King, as much at home in the tree-tops as the monkeys and as facile in the water as the crocodiles, threaded into a story which comes as a welcome relief from the realities of the more matter-of-fact world of today.

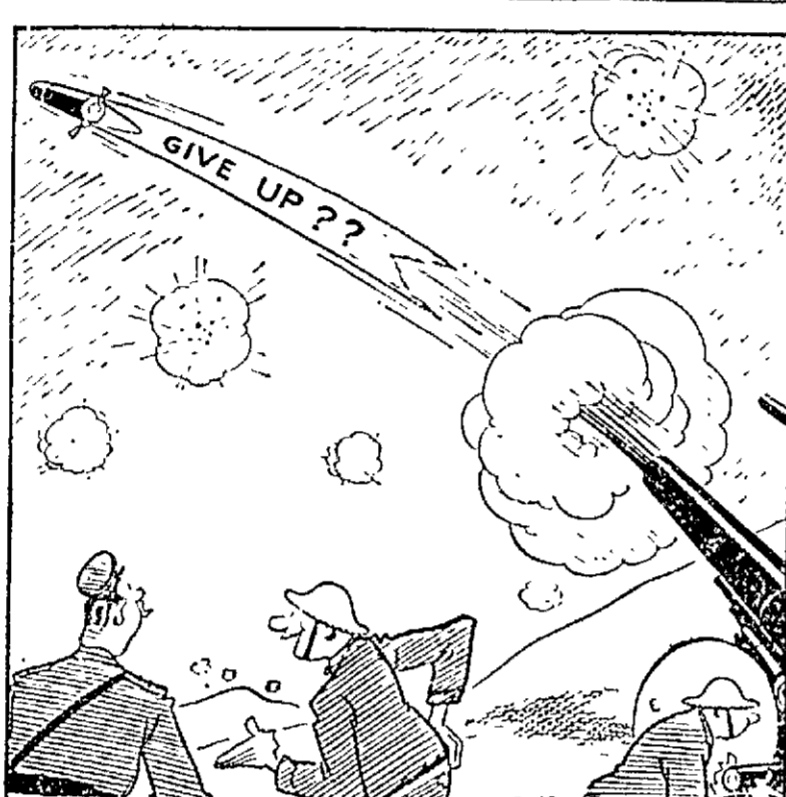

Charles Laughton To Read Well-Loved Christmas Poem

"A Visit From St. Nicholas" Set For 8:30 P. M. Friday; "Gang Busters" Will Trail Band Robbers To Lair

Charles Laughton will read one of the best-loved of all Christmas poems on Three Ring Time Friday at 8:30 p. m. over WJZ. Clement C. Moore's "A Visit from St. Nicholas" which is better known by its opening line, "Twas the Night Before Christmas."

Moore, who died in 1863, was for many years professor of Biblical learning in the General Theological Seminary in New York. The ground on which the seminary stands, indeed, was his gift. "A Visit From St. Nicholas" was one of a collection of poems which Moore published in 1811.

He had written it for his children in 1822 and it first appeared anonymously, without his knowledge, in The Troy Sentinel Dec. 23, 1823.

William Lundigan and Shirley Ross have the romantic leads in this new comedy, which is generously sprinkled with music, and the supporting cast includes such names as Chuck Chandler, Cliff Navarro, Tom Kennedy, Mae Clarke, Mary Anslee, Ruth Donnelly, Bill Shirley and Jane Keane.

The story deals with the adventures and misadventures of one Charles ("Chuck") Stephens, who is allergic to women. His two navy pals, played by Cliff Navarro and Chuck Chandler, trumpt up a gag letter supposedly written him by an attorney notifying him that he will inherit twenty-five thousand dollars provided he marries before his twenty-seventh birthday.

All the gobs on Chuck's boat have notes which they have taken for money they lent Chuck when he got into a jam in Manila, and all are determined that Chuck marry before his birthday so that there will be money forthcoming for them to collect what he owes them.

His two pals, who framed the fake inheritance letter, on the other hand, are equally determined to keep Chuck out of matrimony, for if he marries, their hoax will be exposed and the entire Navy will wreak for vengeance on their heads.

From this merry plot premise the story develops, unfolding a rapid succession of laughs, not to mention some new songs which promise to be exceptional-

ly tuneful as sung by Republic's new tenor, Bill Shirley.
