

# Loretta Young Starred In Film Due Tuesday At Lyric

### Beauty Plays Title Role In "The Lady From Cheyenne;" Second Picture On Double Bill To Be "Devil Bat"

Loretta Young, as an embattled frontier school teacher, has the title role of "The Lady From Cheyenne," which commences Tuesday at the Lyric theatre. Prominent in the cast are Robert Preston, Edward Arnold, Gladys George, Frank Craven, Jessie Ralph, Stanley Fields and Samuel S. Hinds. Co-featured will be "Devil Bat." Concluding Monday are "Tonto Basin Outlaw" and "Rags to Riches."

With Johnny Weissmuller again swinging thru the tree-tops as monarch of his jungle kingdom, and Miss Maureen O'Sullivan again presenting the perfect jungle mate, "Tarzan's Secret Treasure," latest of the Tarzan films, is now at the Ohio theatre. The supporting cast includes such players as Reginald Owen, Philip Dorn, Barry Fitzgerald and Tom Conway.

Gene Autry scores another triumph in his latest screen adventure, "Down Mexico Way," which is currently at the Quilna theatre. Gene marks another victory of the forces of right as he trails a pair of phony motion picture producers into Mexico and prevents them from swindling trustful peons. Co-featured is "Sailors on Leave," starring William Lundigan and Shirley Ross.

The Sigma theatre offers suspense, thrills and absorbing entertainment, the qualities of "Target For Tonight," a simple, factual record of an R. A. F. raid over Germany, Britain's answer to Hitler's Luftwaffe. Members of England's courageous fliers are the cast. Co-featured is "Mob Town," starring Billy Halop, Huntz Hall, Dick Foran and Anne Gwynne.

An up-to-the-minute streamlined comedy of a love blitz that starts in London and wings its way south to Lisbon, is the treat of the Lyric theatre when "One Night in Lisbon" is on the screen. Fred MacMurray and Madeleine Carroll have the romantic leads. Co-featured is "Desperate Trails."

The newest comedy sensation of the entertainment world, Tom Skelton, appears in his first starring film, "Whistling in the Dark," now at the State theatre. Other favorites in the film are Conrad Veidt, Ann Rutherford, Virginia Grey and Eve Arden. Co-featured is "Parachute Battalion," starring Robert Preston, Nancy Kelly, Edmund O'Brien and Harry Carey.

Gene Autry rode in his first rodeo at the age of 12 in Achilles, Oklahoma. . . Today he is the idol of the rodeo circuit, pitching his fans into a frenzy at rodeo performances in the nation's largest cities. . . He has made well over 40 pictures since he started to work for a studio five years ago, the latest being "Down Mexico Way" which comes to the Quilna theatre Tuesday. His first job was traveling with a medicine show; Gene played his guitar and sang ballads. . . His first "big time" job was on the National Barn Dance program over a Chicago station, in which Gene was master of ceremonies. . . He came to Hollywood directly from his Chicago triumph, and has been instrumental in developing an entirely new kind of action entertainment, the musical western.

The classic struggle of American cities—that of the progressive officer hoping to reach the hearts of tough kids before they become lawbreakers—is sharply dramatized in "Mob Town," which is now at the Sigma theatre. A tense melodrama of the pavements "on the wrong side of the tracks," "Mob Town" stars the gifted Dead End Kids and Little Tough Guys with Anne Gwynne and Dick Foran. The famed boy actors are augmented by nine-year-old Darryl Hickman, fresh from his bright performance in "Men of Boy's Town." Foran, as the earnest, warm-hearted officer, shares romantic honors with Miss Gwynne.

The story tells of one officer's heroic and patient labors to abolish "Mob Town" by showing its juvenile chieftains that there is a break for them in organized society, and that the bluecoat is not their natural enemy. The Dead End quartet and Tough Guys with young master Hickman play wild kids who refuse to believe at first in the "copper's" decency, but support him in the end.

Loretta Young stars in the first "western" role of her career in the new frontier comedy, "The Lady From Cheyenne," opening Tuesday at the Lyric theatre. "The Lady From Cheyenne" brings together Miss Young and a distinguished supporting cast that includes Robert Preston, Edward Arnold, Gladys George, Frank Craven, Jessie Ralph, Stanley Fields, Samuel S. Hinds, Willie Best and others.

Based in part on historical incident, Lloyd's comedy takes place on the Wyoming frontier of 1870. Miss Young, as a naive but determined young schoolteacher, comes out from Philadelphia to make her fortune and runs afoul of a gang of crooked politicians led by Arnold and Preston.

A conflicting romance grows between Miss Young and Preston, and meanwhile she is goaded by mounting anger to break the power of the gang. How she accomplishes this supplies the plot for one of the season's most novel and entertaining screen vehicles.
