

INDUCTION OF MARRIED MEN WITH ONLY WIFE AS DEPENDENT IS FORESEEN

COLUMBUS, O., Dec. 23 (UP)—The average Ohioan, aged 20 to 45, who thought he was immune from the draft because he supported his wife might make a pretty good soldier for Uncle Sam's army.

In fact, there is a good chance he will be in uniform sometime before the war is over.

State Selective Service officials said today they "wouldn't be surprised at all" to receive an order from national draft headquarters asking immediate reclassification and induction of all married men whose wives were dependent upon them.

With heavier draft calls anticipated all the time we have to turn to new sources of manpower," Lieut. Col. C. W. Goble, state selective service director, said. "To supply men for an army of a million and a half men is one thing but to supply them for an army of four or five million men is something else.

The new draft law requiring registration of all men between 18 and 64 and making those from 20 to 44 inclusive subject to military service makes possible an army of approximately 4,000,000 men.

Brig. Gen. Lewis B. Hershey, national draft director, announced last week that future draft calls would summon 200,000 men monthly from throughout the nation. Since draft calls are allocated to the states on the basis of population Ohio's monthly calls under the stepped-up system would amount to almost 10,000 men a month.

The 35 calls issued in Ohio in the past year have averaged less than 2,000 men each.

Col. Goble said it was "logical" to turn to the men in class 3-A as a source of supply of army manpower because approximately 70 per cent of all registrants fall into that classification. Only seven
