Others in the cast are Edgar Buchanan, Roger Clark, Ruth Donnelly and Melville Cooper.

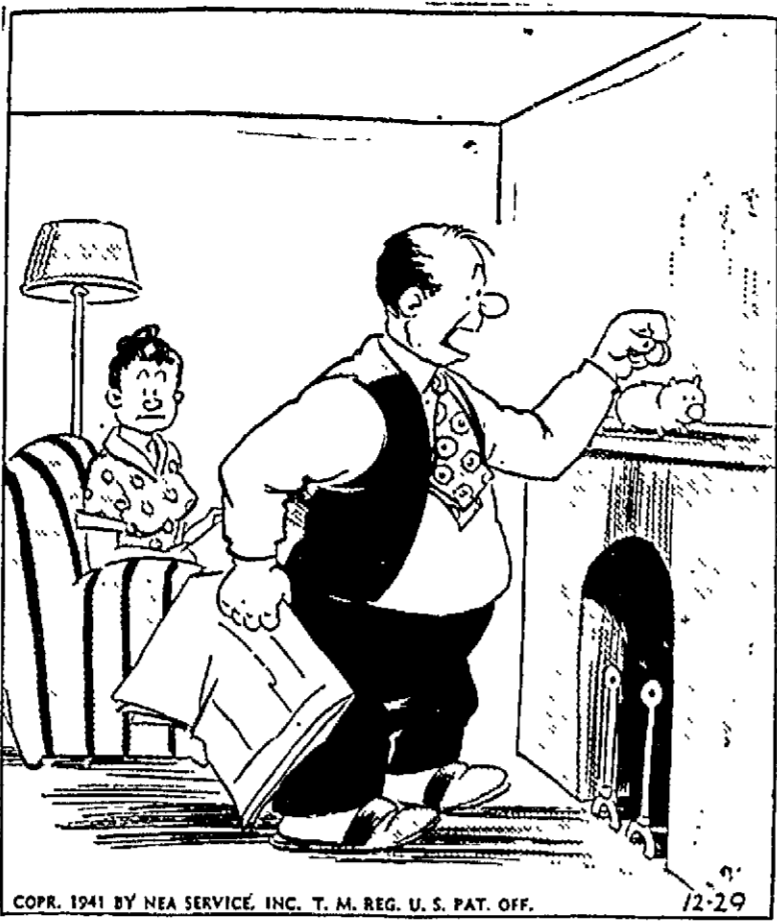
Between his earnest efforts to obtain a police card from some amiable managing editor, Fonda worked as a trouble-shooter for the local telephone company.

STORIES IN STAMPS

Capital of Inca Empire Was Located in Ecuador

QUITO, capital of the republic of Ecuador, pictured on the map stamp above, has been one of the most important cities of South America for centuries.

The equator, from which Ecuador derives its name, crosses the republic near the capital, but the altitude of the city makes its climate temperate.

Construction of the railroad between Quito and Guayaquil, the principal seaport, was one of the world's greatest feats of engineering.

Ecuador lies between Colombia, of which it was once a part, and Peru. Eastern boundaries are still in dispute.

The country is rich in undeveloped mineral resources. Agricultural products include cereals, fruits, cocoa and coffee.
