

Lima Theatres To Present Programs On New Year's Eve

Quilna Will Have Hellenger Film; Rooney Booked On Ohio Screen; Lyric To Offer Double Bill For Fans

Preparations are being made to entertain celebrants Wednesday evening who prefer to usher in the New Year attending special showings of appropriate holiday films at Lima theatres.

The Quilna theatre program includes the first showing of "Rise and Shine," a Mary Hellenger story starring Jack Oakie, George Murphy, Walter Brennan, Linda Darnell and Milton Berle, unpacking a basketful of laughs in a campus story.

Hollywood's finest juvenile talent, headed by Mickey Rooney and Judy Garland, arrives at the Ohio theatre Wednesday evening in the new musical, "Babes on Broadway," with a supporting cast including Fay Bainter, Virginia Weidler, Donald Meek and Alexander Woollcott.

New Year's Eve at the Lyric theatre lists "Ice-Capades" appropriate winter film, with James Ellison, Jerry Colonna and Dorothy Lewis in the starring roles of the film featuring the fast-gliding artists of the frozen rink, the Ice-Capades company.

Clark Gable and Lana Turner form the starring romantic team of the State theatre hit, "Honky Tonk," each in the type roles that carried them to their present status in film popularity.

"Babes on Broadway" is built for entertainment from start to finish. Dealing with the scores of youngsters who yearly invade Broadway to fight for their "break" on the stage, it covers a wide panorama of theatrical life both front and backstage.

These cover a wide latitude of dances and song numbers ranging from such old-timers as George M. Cohan's "Yankee Doodle Dandy" to such brand-new numbers as "How About You" and "Hoe Down," the latter also introducing a new dance which is destined to sweep the country.

There is so much entertainment packed into "Babes on Broadway" that it is hard to single out any one specialty, but a definite highlight of the evening will be the imitations done by Rooney and Miss Garland—Rooney doing the Harry Lauder, Richard Mansfield and ending up with "Hombshell from Brazil," in which he does a brilliant take-off on the fiery Carmen Miranda.

Judy also scores with her impersonations of Blanche Ring, Fay Templeton and Sarah Bernhardt.

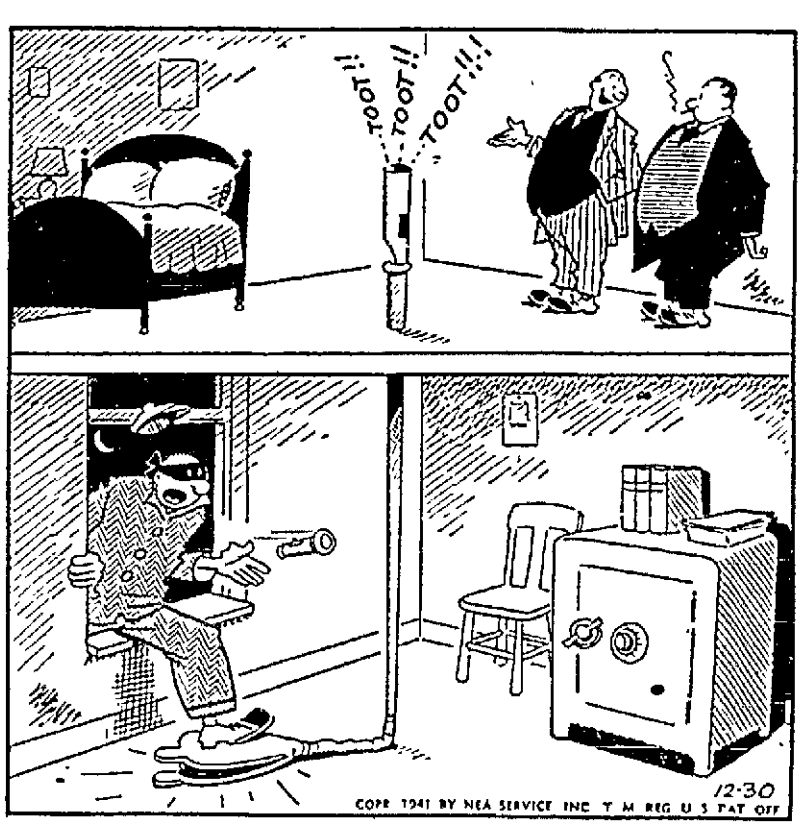
