WASHINGTON, Jan. 5-(AP) -The agriculture department reported today that preliminary estimates indicated farmers received a total cash income, including government benefit payments, of \$11,600,000,000 in 1941, the highest since 1920.

This estimate compares with a 1940 income of \$9,120,000,000 and with a depression low of \$4, 682,000,000 in 1932. Officials have predicted that farm income in 1942 would ex-


ceed \$13,000,000,000. Benefit phyments in 1941 otaled \$600,000,000 compared
