# Change Won't Win, Morgenthau Says

WASHINGTON - (U.P.) - The United States is embarked on a vast and costly war "that cannot be won with spare change," Secretary of the Treasury Henry Morgenthau said Sunday night in a radio appeal to American workers to buy defense bonds in huge quantities.

Morgenthau directed his appeal particularly to the 40,000,000 Americans who earn regular pay, and recalled President Roosevelt's statement of last week that the nation must devote half of its national income to the all-out war

"This is a people's war," he said. "This is not a token war. It is not a 2 per cent war. It is not a war that can be won with spare change. Each of us will have to figure out the very most that we can set aside to buy defense bonds, for our own good and for our country's good, as long as the war may last:"

Morgenthau, citing "proof that the country remembers Pearl Harbor," said that defense bond sales in December produced more than \$528,000,000, a record total and twice as much as the average for the previous seven months of preparation for war.


