

Romantic Drama Being Shown On Screen At Ohio Theatre

"International Lady" Is Thrill-Packed Film Of War-Time Intrigue; Several Stars Featured

With George Brent, Ilona Massey and Basil Rathbone in the top starring roles, "International Lady," a thrill-packed spy melodrama highlighting the activities of a gang of international saboteurs, is now at the Ohio theatre. The supporting cast features Gene Lockhart and George Zucco as the story unfolds its dramatic action in London, Lisbon and New York.

Carole Landis, George Montgomery and John Shepperd are the stars of "Cadet Girl," romantic film of West Point, which commences at the Thursday preview showing at the Quilna theatre. Don Ameche and Joan Bennett are the stars of the co-feature, "Confirm or Deny," a story of front line war correspondents. Showing for the last times Thursday is "Rise and Shine," starring Jack Oakie.

Robert Preston and Ellen Drew are the romantic stars of the mystery film, "The Night of January 16," which is currently at the Sigma theatre. Nils Asther and Margaret Hayes have prominent roles in the thrilling story. Co-featured is "Riders of the Timberline," starring William Boyd in another exciting "Hopalong" Cassidy adventure.

The Lyric theatre offers the comedy sensation of last year, "Charley's Aunt," with Jack Benny in the title role. Kay Francis and James Ellison have starring roles in the story of the man who masqueraded in a woman's costume to help a pair of school chums. Co-featured is "The Cowboy and the Blonde," starring Mary Beth Hughes and George Montgomery. "Married Bachelor," starring Robert Young and Ruth Hussey, is the current comedy attraction at the State theatre, which also offers "Burma Convoy," an exciting film starring Charles Bickford and Evelyn Ankers.

Played against a background of bomb-riddled London in September, 1940, "Confirm or Deny" at the Quilna commencing with the Thursday preview is the thrill-packed story of a newspaperman who gives up the scoop of a lifetime for love of a girl.

Don Ameche is starred as the Yankee news scribe, representing a large American syndicate in London. Playing opposite him is Joan Bennett in the role of a courageous and lovely English girl whose loyalty to her country surpasses her love for the Yank. A top notch supporting cast includes Roddy McDowall, as the plucky English lad who scoops the world; John Leder as the British censor fighting the war's strangest battle 300 feet underground, and a host of others including Eric Blore, Raymond Walburn and Arthur Shields contribute an exciting performance.

"Confirm or Deny" was directed by Archie Mayo and produced by Len Hammond. They story was written by Henry Wales, internationally noted foreign correspondent, and Samuel Fuller.

Blonde Carole Landis sings new Robin and Rainer songs in tuncful hit, "Cadet Girl," which will be co-featured. George Montgomery listens to the songstress and John Shepperd leads the band. William Tracy is also importantly cast in this picture.

Thrilling suspense, top-notch acting, brilliant direction and a smooth production are a few of the highlights which distinguish the melodrama, "International Lady," which is at the Ohio theatre. The supporting cast also turns in superb portrayals. Among those deserving special mention are Basil Rathbone as a gentleman from Scotland Yard; Gene Lockhart, who turns up as a wealthy candy manufacturer, owner of a vast Long Island estate, which happens to be a screen for the schemes of a saboteur ring; Martin Kosleck, who plays a member of the gang; and George Zucco, also in a meanie role.
