We Can Do It, State Labor Tells FDR

MILWAUKEE—(U.P.)—Wisconsin labor leaders Tuesday were confident that the huge armament program outlined to congress by President Roosevelt could be accomplished. Industrialists desired further time to study implications of the program.

Herman Seide, president of the AFL Wisconsin State Federation of Labor, asserted that ample manpower and facilities are available and saw the coordination of these two factors as the most difficult problem.

"American labor never has been stumped on a production problem," Seide declared.

He pointed out, however, that skilled workers now are walking the streets idle in a number of Wisconsin cities because of employment dislocations resulting from lack of materials in various lines of civilian production.

This idle manpower must be put back in production at once, he said.

Meyer Adelman, district director of the Steel Workers organizing committee for Wisconsin and northern Illinois, echoed Seide's sentiments and added that loss of time because of industrial accidents also must be reduced materially.

B. C. Buchanan, president of the Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Co., said that President Roosevelt had outlined an "ambitious program" for American industry.
