Pamiroff came to America in 1923 after a period with the Moscow Art theatre, and obtained a job that Baileff's "Chauve Souris."

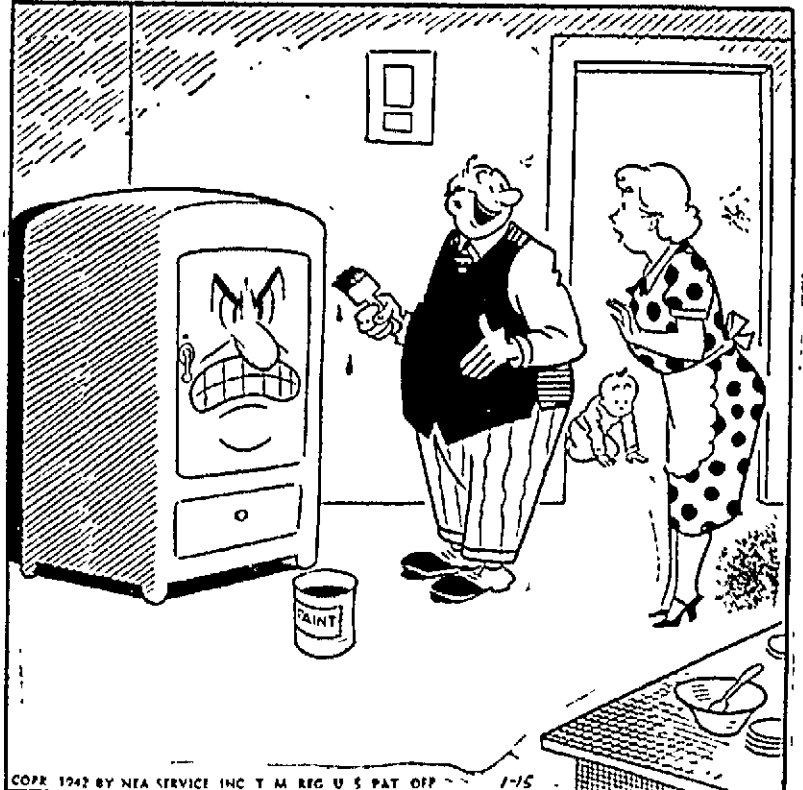
