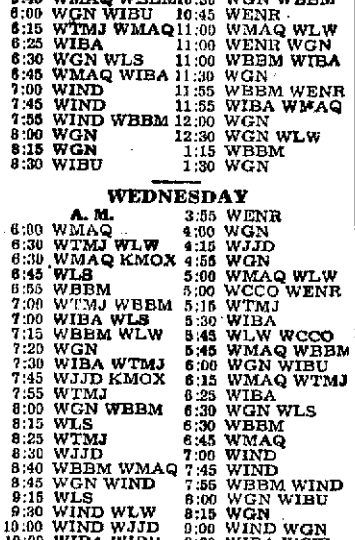

Gestapo Role Simple for Him



It's a Natural: Pursued Pursues

HOLLYWOOD—(U.P.)—In "Joan of Paris," one of the new pictures, a little guy playing the part of a Gestapo agent, who gum-shoes all through the film, keeping tab on the hero and his girl.

Wherever Paul Henreid and Michelle Morgan go, there also goes the plump little man in the derby hat. Paul sneaks into a movie to escape him and there the Gestapo man is howling at the picture. Paul takes a Turkish bath, just to get away from him, and there he is waiting without a shirt when the steam clears away.

The little guy never says a word. Yet he is a memorable performance and it developed today—for good reason.

He knows all about acting like a Gestapo agent chasing somebody, because the Gestapo agents spent years chasing him.

A Fine Actor

His name is Alexander Granach and he is one of the fine actors of pre-Hitler Germany. That Germany is gone now. Granach's son now is in the Middle East as a member of Great Britain's Royal Air Force while Granach is liable to become a Hollywood fixture.

His is a little rip-snorter of a story: In the 20's, when Hitler was just another Berlin politician, he frequently saw Granach on the stage. Granach saw him, too, but paid no attention.

"But things got unpleasant for us Jews in Berlin as early as 1933," Granach said. "So I left for a good, neutral country. I chose Austria, playing on the stage there in 'Dinner at Eight.'"

"Our run hardly had started before the Gestapo filtered into the country. You could smell the Nazis, they were so thick."

Granach's next stop was Warsaw, in Poland, where he starred in "Professor Mamlock." Then Moscow, where he played in many a Russian movie, including "Gypsies" which did well in the American theaters.

"But things soon got hot for me in Russia, too," he said. "I was a German and the Russians didn't like Germans of any breed. So I got out my map and looked and looked for a country where I could work in peace. In all of Europe there was only one such place. I went there. Switzerland."

Then Macbeth

In this last strictly neutral country on the continent, Granach starred in "Macbeth."

"But that show could not go on indefinitely," he said, "and I started looking at my map some more. I called upon the American minister and I asked him how I could come here. He wanted to know if I had \$5,000 in cash. I did. He wanted if I had any friends in the United States. I mentioned William Dieterle and Ernst Lubitsch.

"Then the minister wanted to know what I did for a living. I said I was an actor, that I had been playing in 'Macbeth.' He said he'd seen the performance the night before. What part did I take, he asked? I told him I was Macbeth in person and he shook my hand and here I am and I hope I never have to leave."

Granach spoke German in Berlin, Polish in Warsaw, Russian in Moscow, and French in Zurich. When he arrived in New York a couple of years ago, he spoke not one word of English. He learned the language in a hurry.
