Market Agreements Unaffected by Court

Marketing agreements in Wisconsin, with the exception of Superior, will not be affected by the United States supreme court judgment holding that where interstate competition is a factor the federal agricultural department has control over milk sales agreements, according to the belief of the officials of the Wisconsin board of agriculture.

The agreements in Wisconsin are voluntary between producers and distributors, and therefore not subject to federal control.

Superior is, however, under a federal order. There is a similar suit pending from that area to exempt a dealer from the order on the ground he sold only in Wisconsin and not interstate shipped milk.

The agricultural department and the attorney general's office have, however, asked a copy of the opinion be forwarded to them.
