The plot has Douglas marrying Miss Garbo, as the ski instructor, then falling for the charms of a lady playwright, played by Constance Bennett.

A brilliant supporting cast was gathered for the new picture by M-G-M. Together with Miss Bennett, featured roles are played by Roland Young, fresh from his "Topper" successes, and now cast as Douglas' harassed business partner, Robert Sterling.

AAA AUDITING CORPS TO MOVE TO COLUMBUS

COLUMBUS, O., Feb. 5.—(INS)—Federal officials today canvassed Columbus for office space for the auditing and accounts sections of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration which will be moved from Washington to the Ohio capital for workers in essential defense departments.

Ohio AAA officials were in Chicago and were not available for comment on the move. The state AAA office, where 100 persons are employed, is quartered in the old post-office building.

Announcement of the removal of the offices to Columbus followed announcement a day earlier of the removal of 633 employees of the Farm Security Administration to Cincinnati.

MEMORIAL TO FORMER JUDGE TO BE DRAFTED

COLUMBUS, O., Feb. 5.—(UP)—The state supreme court has appointed a five-member committee to prepare a written memorial to the late supreme court judge, William F. Garver of Holmes-co.
