Library Adds Three Books About Lincoln

Although more than 3,500 books about Abraham Lincoln already have been published, good new ones always are appearing. During the past week, the Madison free library bought three new volumes about the "Great Emancipator." They are featured in the special display for Lincoln's birthday. The library catalog lists 131 titles of books about the civil war president. His fame is evidenced

hams discussess the civil war in the light of the fight between Lincoln and the men who wanted to turn the war into an abolition crusade to destroy slavery and

the southern social system.
The editors of "Life" magazine might have edited "Lincoln: His Life in Photographs." But it was assembled by Stefan Lorant-a Hongarlan who has been in American for less than a year, What began as a scrapbook for his 10-year-old son developed into a complete pictorial record of Linconl's life. Many of the 400 photos are new even to scholars. A chronological arrangement of the photographs, a concise running commentary, and a comprehensive bibliography of extant pictures combine to make this unique addition to the library collection.

Dr. John E. Washington, author of "They Knew Lincoln," grew up close to the old Ford theater where Lincoln was assassinated. Since childhood, he has listened to reminiscences and anecdotes of Lincoln told by Negroes of the neighborhood. He interviewed numbers of men and women who served Lincoln during the war. He checked their stories, and set them down in the language of the

original narrators. "Reveille in Washington" Margaret Leech's best-selling study of our capital during the civil war contains much material of interest to students of Lincoln's life. Dixon Wector devotes a large portion of "The Hero in America" to a discussion of the character and psychology of our admira-tion for "Honest Abe."

Biographies by Charnwood, Tarbell, Sandburg, Ludwig, Nicolay, and Hertz also are available, along with many volumes that


